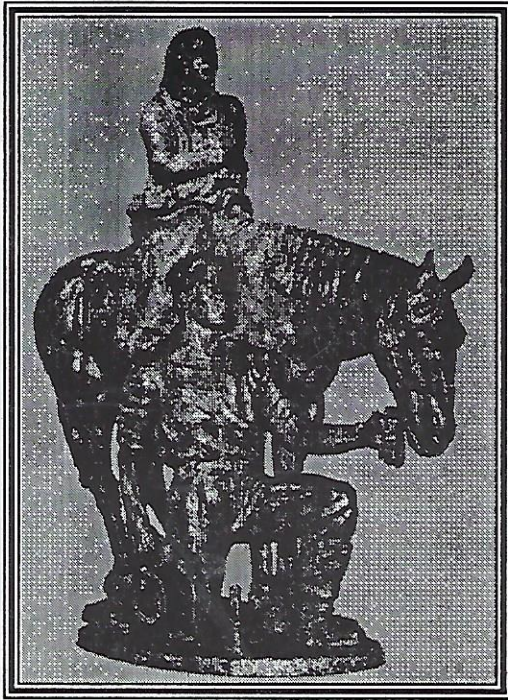

CFCPO STATEMENT OF FAITH

WE BELIEVE

THE BIBLE: The Scripture of the Old and New Testaments were verbally inspired of God and inerrant in the original writings and that they are the Supreme and final authority for our faith and life (2 Tim. 3:16, 17; 2 Peter 1:20,21).

GRACE: Eternal life is a free gift and cannot be earned. We are saved by grace and not by our own works (Eph. 2:8, 9; Rom. 6:23).

HUMAN: We are sinners, and that by His death upon the cross, the Lord Jesus Christ made a perfect atonement for sin, redeeming us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse in our place (Rom. 3:23; John 3:18; Rom. 10:9,10).

GOD: There is one God. Holy, eternally existing and manifesting Himself to us in three persons. Father, Son and Holy Spirit. God is merciful and loves us, but is just and must punish sin (John 14:6, 10; Exodus 34:7; Matt. 28:9; John 3:16).

CHRIST: Jesus Christ is God incarnate. He was supernaturally conceived, born of a virgin, was put to death by crucifixion under Pontius Pilot, was raised from the dead on the third day, and now sits at the Father's right hand whence He is coming again personally, bodily and visibly (Luke 1:26-35; 1 Cor. 15:3, 4; Eph. 1:13; Eph. 4:4,5).

HOLY SPIRIT: The Holy Spirit is God He indwells all believers having baptized them in the body of Christ at the time of regeneration (Rom. 10:9, 10; 1 Cor. 12:13, 14; Eph. 4:4, 5).

FAITH: All those who by faith receive Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour, and who confess Him as such before their fellowmen become heirs of God and joint heirs with Jesus Christ (Rom. 10:9; Eph. 2:8, 9; Rom. 8:16, 17).

JUDGEMENT: Those who reject the love of God and the saving work of Christ will be judged and punished for sin. They will be eternally separated from God (John 16:7-11; Psalm 89:32; Exodus 34:7; Jude 14:15; John 3:18).

This book of the law shall not depart from your mouth, but you shall meditate on it day and night, so that you may be careful to do

according to all that is written in it, for then you will make your way prosperous, and then you will have success. (Josh. 1:8)

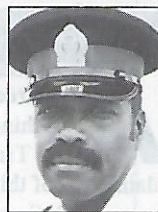

a realistic assessment as it isn't something some have and others don't. It comes with action.

Man's arrogance allows him to think of himself more highly than he is. But, genuinely humble people have a more realistic assessment of themselves, allowing them to live more comfortably with themselves. And now the crunch - Christians should have a headstart. 1 Peter 5:5 tells us that God is opposed to the proud. Peter knew a lot more about pride because he felt superior to others. Pride makes others think of self and Peter was good at that (remember his denial?). Pride makes us think of our own capabilities away from God; that we are better than others, rejecting what God says and deciding to go our own way. Is it a mystery then that God would say "Pride do I hate"?

If we are to sense the mighty hand of God we will have to submit to "Christ's enabling." *"And the God of all grace, who called you to his eternal glory in Christ, after you have suffered a little while, will himself restore you and make you strong, firm and steadfast." To Him be the power for ever and ever Amen* (1 Peter 5:10-11).

HOW TO PRAY?

In our last publication, I started a theme on prayer that ended with a quotation from a great servant of God, Selwyn Hughes.

On the 10th of November, the Halton Chapter of the FCPO conducted a service at the All Nations Baptist Church, Weston, Ontario. I was blessed to hear our brothers share, play the accordion, all to the glory of God. I listened to Bob GRIMBLY, a retired police officer from the Hamilton Wentworth Regional Police Force, share on the Lord's prayer and was elated when he gave me the go ahead to use his study as part of this continuing theme.

**"THAT WE MIGHT HAVE
ETERNAL LIFE"**

"When we love someone deeply, we long to be with them. Whenever I have to leave my family I look forward to the time I can again be with them. My life is only really complete when we are together. This was the same spirit Jesus mentioned when He prayed, *"Father, I desire that they also whom You gave Me may be with Me where I am, that they may behold My glory which you have given Me; for you loved Me before the foundation of the world"* (John 17:24).

What a grand way to end the prayer of Christ. In that last plea we begin to see just how much we mean to Him. What Christ is actually saying is that Heaven will not be complete until we are with Him forever.

With such a deep knowledge of Christ's love for us, we have a healthy confidence to live and a longing to share our Lord with our fellowman. And, when we learn how Christ prayed, we can imitate His prayer and more perfectly fulfil the will of our Father. (See Matt. 6:9-13; it is the basis of this study).

There is a pattern to powerful praying. Christ taught it, and this is known as the "Lords Prayer." It is a simple formula for bringing prayer power to our lives. Recorded twice in scripture, what is known as the "Lord's Prayer" is actually His believer's prayer. Divided into ten short sections, the prayer can be easily memorized by all. However, this is not the purpose. Rather, it forms an outline of prayer and we are to add our own words from our deep feelings. It is carefully structured by our Lord to show us exactly how to pray".

"Come and fill us afresh with Your Holy Spirit this day and do in us what You did to your early disciples and set our prayer life on fire." Through Jesus Christ our Lord.

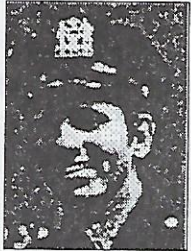

His wife and children are all ticked off about the socks and want to know where they go; he told them they went to live with Jesus.

The story continues with much laughter before he talked about the birth of Jesus and the manner in which we give our gifts.

He talked about the Magi who came to worship the King and bring gifts. But his thoughts were on where were the Magi when Easter came around. Where were the Magi when the story of Calvary took place 33 years later?

Was it easier for the Magi to give gifts to a child who was not equipped with the ability to know, he thought? "Maybe the problem approaching the cross is that as you look at Christ, His eyes penetrate all that you are because He knows you." Knowing ourselves sometimes is not very comfortable because there are things about ourselves we're not crazy about. But, you can't go to the cross without Jesus knowing it; since God had prepared Jesus to be fully God and man.

We usually give what we can afford but he challenged us to get in on the action of the cross, and giving regardless of the cross. The reason Christ was there is because He knows us and paid the ultimate price for us. He asks us to follow Him and He will give us peace, something the Magi could not give us.

Gerry went on to say, he did not know what it felt like being a cop and read a portion from a letter written to him by a police officer. "To the frightening nine year old girl, my presence was a symbol not only of hope but the existence of some sort of order amidst the presence of confusion, pain, fear and chaos. I was a convenient recipient for the fears, indecision and yes, even the sense of responsibility the group felt was mine. I sense that all that was required from me was a few simple instructions and that group of disorganized and confused onlookers would be galvanized into an organization of restoring order."

He compared what the nine year old saw in the policeman, a symbol of authority and comfort, to what we receive from Christ when we approach the cross of Calvary. "That great sense of comfort, security, and encouragement. Beyond the chaos of this crazy world, that does not know where it is





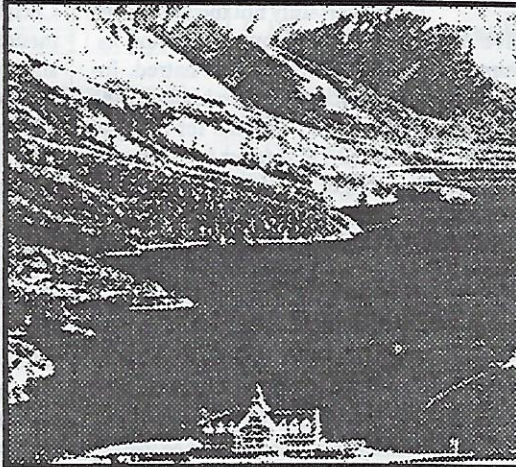

CHRISTIAN LAW ENFORCEMENT?

Is it possible? by Heather Percy

To my great surprise, I have just discovered that Canada was once considered a Christian country. I guess most of you already knew that, but I was not born a Canadian, so had never been taught about the heritage of this great country. Even when I became a Canadian citizen, none of my required studies indicated this to me. It was in a recent course at Ontario Theological Seminary on the History of Christianity in Canada where I learned this amazing fact. I learned that schools across this country were started by churches, and the various social programs were instigated by Christians from all denominations working together to help those in need. There was even a time when laws were made and administered from a Christian perspective.

This is certainly not the picture we have of the society we now see around us. Ours is a society of sorrow and hatred. Increased thefts indicate the harshness of the economy, and a lack of respect for the law; and a sharp increase in murder indicates the increase in our anger. No one sees this more clearly than you, our police officers.

This deterioration may have occurred because Christians became complacent with their place in society, and did not notice their rights being eroded. It may also have occurred because Christians began to legislate rules for Christian behaviour in their society, rather than remembering that their Christianity came from a change in their heart. You would probably be appalled to realize that there was a time in Canada's Christian history that Canadianizing and Christianizing immigrants were seen as one and the same thing. We thought we could change people through laws.

Now, you and I both know that laws are necessary. I would not want to live without them, and I would not want to live in a society where they were not enforced. But we need more than enforcement. We need society to be once again touched by the

influence of God's people. The touch that shows the love of God for the hungry, the jobless, the abused, the destitute, the lonely, the angry people.

I am a parent, and I struggle every day with how to maintain a balance between love and discipline. When I am handing out discipline I find it hard to show love, and vice versa. But God says that both are important. (*...for those whom the Lord loves He disciplines ... Hebrews 12:6a*) As Christian law enforcement officers you are in a unique position in society. In a way you are the surrogate parents of society. You enforce the laws of the society - and do a good job of it. But are you also able to show God's love while doing this?

Some people think that being a Christian equates to being a whimp. How mistaken they are. A Christian who is able to show God's love to society while at the same time administering the laws of the land is no whimp.

This balancing act of love and justice is a tough one. Let me give you some examples to think about.

1. You have to arrest a father for abusing his wife and children. It is easy to love and feel pity for the wife and children. But would God require you to also love the father? Was he also abused as a child? Did anyone come to his rescue? Can God's love redeem him? How do you balance love and justice here? Will pure law change this person?

2. You have a prisoner who is absolutely vile. Known as the most dangerous prisoner, you and your staff take great precautions in dealing with him. You protect your lives, and rightly so. Is he beyond reach? Hopeless?

3. The little old lady keeps calling the dispatcher. There are noises around her house. Must be prowlers. Could the scout car come by and check just one more time? How

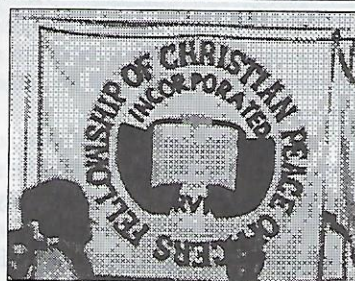

GARDENING TIPS

"Gardener Extraordinaire"

AND the Lord God planted a garden in Eden, in the East;.....and the Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till and KEEP it. (Genesis 2:8, 15)

We are approaching Spring, with the sun warming up the earth in preparation for the new growing season.

Planning ahead is so important. Look at your garden and see how you can improve it by changing the looks of your flower beds. For example, curved flower beds are much more attractive especially in corners. Straight beds look best along walkways.

Position your plants according to height; the shortest at the front, medium in the middle and tallest at the back. Before planting, get the soil ready by mixing 1/3 earth, 1/3 peatmoss and 1/3 cattle manure; mulch in well.

Choose perennials that bloom at different times as this will give color to your garden all during the season. To mention a few: **Early Summer:** *sedum, alyssum* (dwarf); **Late Summer:** *plax, potentilla* (medium); **Fall:** *aster, chrysanthemums* (tall).

SPRING LAWN MAINTENANCE:

Lawn repairs should be done in early Spring to give time for growth. Rake and level the grass area, adding top soil if necessary. Sod or seed the area and make sure that the soil is moist. Sprinkle with mixture of top soil and peatmoss, then roll for seeds to make contact with the soil.

The best time to water is early in the morning as the grass has time to dry before night, lessening the chance of disease.

FERTILIZE YOUR LAWN:

☼Spring March - April ☼Summer July - August ☼Fall September - October. In Fall, use a fertilizer rich in nitrogen for an early green lawn.

BASIC GARDENING TOOLS:

⇐Hand trowel ⇐Hand pruning sheers
⇐Weeder ⇐Spade ⇐Edger ⇐Lawn rake with adjustable handle ⇐Dutch hoe.

do you handle this cry of loneliness when you are already short staffed?

4. How do you handle the irate motorist who grudgingly signs the speeding ticket while complaining that you should be out catching REAL crooks?

Now, I'm not claiming to have the answers to the above questions. If I did I would be the world's best parent, and I'm definitely not. Just ask my kids!!

But we need to think about these things as Christians. If God is to ever be a part of our society again, he will only do so through us, His people. If the abuser is to be rehabilitated, he will need God's healing in his life. If the violent criminal is to be changed, only God's love can do that. How does God do it? Does he "zap" them from heaven? No! He uses His people to show His love and healing to other people. It is God's people who can relieve the loneliness of the old woman.

You are the front lines in this work of God. You see people at their very worst. And it is at their worst, when things can get no worse, that God can best reach these people.

To conclude this article, I don't want to leave you with the impression that I think you should be out there disciplining and preaching to society with the same breath. We Christians are a family. You are just one part of this family. I want to leave you with another question.

HOW CAN WE, THE REST OF GOD'S FAMILY, HELP YOU, SO THAT, TOGETHER, THE FAMILY OF GOD HAS A PART IN THE DISCIPLINE AND REDEMPTION OF SOCIETY?
