

It was a couple of days before Sharon and I left on our trip to visit the F.C.P.O. Chapters across Western Canada. "Why should I go out west, what can I say, how can you use me, Lord, when I feel so barren, inept and useless?" I cried out to God on the drive home.

Sharon was asleep, so I got ready for bed and then opened up the F.C.P.O. mail I had picked up that very night. Tillsonburg, Ont. had become a Chapter, Dalhousie, N.B. was very interested, several people sent membership applications, and Don Leskowski of Saskatoon sent me a nice letter regarding our trip. I felt so grateful to God, and yet so unworthy of being involved in a ministry that was having such farreaching effects.

As is my practise before retiring, I opened the Bible and started to read 2 Corinthians 2. But as soon as verse 14 hit my eye, I knew that God Himself was powerfully communicating with me-as one of His beloved children. My eyes misted over and my heart was stilled as I read these precious words that the Holy Spirit must have written just for me (or so I felt, so intimate was this message from Jesus). "But thanks be to God! For through what Christ has done, he has triumphed over us so that now wherever we go he uses us to tell others about the Lord and to spread the Gospel like a sweet perfume. As far as God is concerned there is a sweet, wholesome fragrance in our lives. It is the fragrance of Christ within us, an aroma to both the saved and the unsaved all around us. To those who are not being saved, we seem a fearful smell of death and doom, while to those who know Christ we are a life-giving perfume" (2 Cor. 2:14-16a).

I started sobbing in gratitude as I realized the enormity of what God was telling me. Jesus lives right inside me! And because He does, God only smells the deliciously sweet aroma of Christ's amazing love-life emanating from us. And others, both those saved or lost, will catch the fragrance of the Divine from our lives as well. They have to, because as disciples our form is that of an incense container or perfume bottle, designed to not only hold, but also to distribute the life-giving perfume of Jesus Christ to all who inhabit this globe.

"Oh," I cried with Paul, "who is adequate for such a task as this?" And God's Word directly replies: all those who "are men of integrity, sent by God, speaking with Christ's power . . ." (2 Cor. 2:17). Dear Lord, may this truth ever be a reality in our life and experience!

Testimonies

An Opportunity Through Prayer

My wife, Andrea, and I had prayed before my shift (11 p.m. to 7 a.m.) that the power of the Holy Spirit would go out before me this night and prepare a person, a place and a time that I may share the <u>free gift</u> of eternal life through our Lord Jesus Christ. As God would have it, He provided all of the above!

By the very nature of our professions as peace officers, we are trained to be ever mindful of our safety and that of those citizens we have been sworn to protect and serve. With that thought, I conducted a traffic stop of a car I had followed. Suspecting that the driver may be under the influence of alcohol and/or drugs, I requested that the gentleman perform the field sobriety tests. As I had suspected, the gentleman did not pass the sobriety tests and I placed him under arrest for driving while under the influence of alcoholic beverages. As is customary, I advised our dispatcher of the arrest I had just effected and that I would require a certified intoxilyzer operator. The dispatcher's reply both caught me off guard and upset me: "There are no x32's tonight" (intoxilyzer operator). I grumbled to myself, "How can this be? We always have an operator on duty. I can't believe this."

I transported my prisoner to the county jail and was advised there that an operator had been located but his arrival to the county jail to administer the breath tests "would be awhile".

While awaiting the operator's arrival, I began the task of required paperwork and the interviewing of the young man I had just arrested. While conducting the interview, I noticed on his right inner arm a bulge next to his vein. There it was . . red, black, blue and swollen . . . the sign of a narcotics user. As I reached out to grab his arm so that I may inspect his self-inflicted needle marks, he looked away, and with tears in his eyes said, "I'm ashamed." When I asked why he was ashamed, he answered, "I'm hooked and I need help."

With that statement, I was moved to share the Gospel with this gentleman. In a private interview room provided for us at my request, I began praying to the Lord under my breath: "Lord, give me words and wisdom to share with this person the plan of salvation." I also prayed that this man be of a sober mind to fully understand what I was about to share with him. With that unspoken prayer completed, the young man looked at me again with tears in his eyes and said, "I'm so lonely." I then began to share the mighty and great things that the Lord Jesus Christ has and is doing in my life. I also shared with him that I know someone he should meet who would be a "friend and a comforter" to him. As we continued to discuss his emptiness, the wall that could have divided us as deputy and prisoner was not there. This young man was crying out to God for help. As I outlined the plan of salvation and how he can receive the free gift of eternal life (Ephesians 2:8-9), I asked him if what I said made sense to him and he said "Yes". And when I asked him if he would like to receive Jesus Christ into his life and make Christ Lord of his life, again he replied "Yes".

I should stop here for two very important points: (1) This young man was not falling down sloppy drunk, nor, in my opinion, unable to receive the plan of salvation and make a rational decision. (2) It was made very clear to this person that, prior

to our praying, his praying to receive Jesus Christ into his life as Lord and Savior had nothing whatsoever to do with the charge of D.U.I. (driving under the influence) that I had arrested him for. He assured me that he understood, and we prayed the "sinner's prayer" together early that morning. After praying with him, I asked him to read from my pocket New Testament a Scripture for his assurance: "Verily, verily, I say unto you, he that believeth on me hath everlasting life" (John 6:47).

So it was done as we had prayed. The Holy Spirit had gone out before me so that I might be used to tell others of God's eternal love.

As I walked away from the jail bars that were closing behind me, I turned to look at my new "brother in Christ", and with a smile on his face he said "Thank you".

God Marshals His Force In Germany

Inspector Lutz Rohmer of the West German Police found a Christian policeman from Liverpool, England who put him in touch with another person who put him in touch with the Toronto Chapter of the F.C.P.O. He and P.C. John Walker (Toronto Police) have been writing each other now since late 1985.

Inspector Rohmer writes: "I am 29 years old, married and we are going to have a baby in a few months. (Baby David was born on June 17th, 1986.) I was converted a few months before I joined the force in 1975. Being a Christian and a police officer was very hard for me in those days. I seemed to be the only one on the force. But I became acquainted with a C.I.D. officer who is a Christian, and we had fellowship and still do. It was a big help to both of us.

"I am on duty in the uniformed police branch and I was promoted to the rank of police inspector. I am the commanding officer of a block of about 30 officers in a special area of our township.

"Until 1982 we did not know of any other officer who was a Christian. But then I got an invitation for a first meeting of some Christian police officers in the New Life Center near Cologne. Now we know about 500 officers all over Germany, but only about 100 are members of the association. I am sure that there will be found more if the association becomes better known in Germany. I saw the revival amongst the force during Mission England last year (1985), and I hope and pray that God will do the same in my country.

"After joining the C.P.A. (Christian Police Association), I became the Branch Secretary of the Cologne Force. We met monthly for Bible studies, prayer and fellowship. We need encouragement, forgiveness and fellowship to solve the special problems of being both police officers and Christians.

"In 1983 I started collecting police insignia. When the C.P.A. was founded, we got the chance to publish ourselves in several missionary meetings. Now my hobby is to decorate our booth at these meetings. In Germany it is amazing for people to see uniformed police officers in missionary meetings talking about their faith and their work amongst their colleagues.

"My first time as a senior officer was spent in the main center of Cologne, and so I had the chance to get some store manikins for C.P.A. use. If we decorate a booth we use uniformed manikin officers as an eye hook.

"I would like to know more about the F.C.P.O. and about the work you do in Canada. May God bless you and make you his true witness in this witness box we all stand."

GOD'S "INTRODUCTORY OFFER"

"Introductory Offer"! How many times have we read words like these and reacted with some suspicion? We may even remember personal disappointments as companies in their marketing programs introduced us to their new products. The item may long ago have been discarded as worthless and the "offer" been viewed as nothing more than a sales gimmick. I thought how different from the spiritual realm as God makes His "introductory offer". How different the motives and the results.

There are some questions which are usually part of any such introductory offer. To whom is the offer made? How much does it cost? Is the offer of any worth or value? How long will the offer be made? When we apply some of these simple questions to God's offer, it can help us appreciate the great heart of God to the creatures of His hand; the great love of God and the desire He has to reconcile us to Himself.

God's matchless love is clearly demonstrated in His "introductory offer". He loves sinners but hates their sin. His offer is to all who will acknowledge their sin; their waywardness; their total inability to please God by their own efforts.

It is first of all an offer of forgiveness of sins, for this is what separates us from Him (Is. 59:2). Because of Christ's perfect sacrifice for sin on the cross at Calvary, God can offer complete forgiveness. The Apostle Paul wrote, "Be it known unto you, therefore, men and brethren, that through this man (Jesus Christ) is preached unto you the forgiveness of sins" (Acts 13:38). This offer of forgiveness, although freely given to each one of us, was at infinite cost to God. It didn't come cheap. "All we like sheep have gone astray. We have turned everyone to his own way and the Lord hath laid on him (Jesus) the iniquity of us all" (Is. 53:6). What an offer! Complete forgiveness! No wonder the Bible calls it "Good News"!

That's only the beginning—the tip of the iceberg. God's "introductory offer" includes ETERNAL LIFE—Wow! The words of Jesus Himself confirm this great truth: "Truly, truly, he that heareth my words and believeth on Him that sent me, hath everlasting life and shall not come into judgement but is passed from death unto life" (John 5:24).

These are only a few of the verses which emphasize the value of God's great offer, extended to us NOW. It is for a limited time only. There's no guarantee it will go out tomorrow. "Behold now is the accepted time, behold now is the day of salvation" (2 Cor. 6:2). Would we insult God by saying, "Let me see if I can get a better offer", or by saying, "When I have a convenient season I'll take it".

Occasionally, we neglect to read the fine print on some of the offers we receive, much to our regret or disappointment. But the "fine print" on God's offer opens to us an unfathomable spiritual wealth—a revelation that, upon our acceptance of this great offer, we are the recipients of a great spiritual bounty. "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ who hath blessed us with all spiritual blessings in Christ" (Eph. 1:3).

CREAM PUFFS

Batter

1 cup water 1/2 cup butter (or margarine) 1 cup sifted flour 4 eggs

Filling

whip cream, instant pudding or ice cream

Topping

1 cup icing sugar 2 tbsp. cocoa 1 tbsp. melted butter 2-3 tbsp. boiling water

Heat the water and butter to boiling in * a saucepan. Stir in the flour all at once. Stir in vigorously over low heat * until mixture leaves the pan and forms into a ball (about 1 minute or less). * Remove from heat. Beat in 1 egg at a time. Beat mixture until smooth and * velvety after each addition. Drop from spoon onto ungreased baking sheet. * Bake at 400°F for 45-50 minutes until dry. Allow to cool slowly. Cut in half * and scoop out any uncooked dough. Fill with desired choice of filling. *

For the icing, mix the icing sugar and cocoa, then add the melted butter and boiling water and drissle this over top.
