

WITHOUT A VISION THE PEOPLE PERISH"

Burrr!! I shivered as I stood in the middle of our large (and drafty) living room, which extends from the side of our rented house like the prow of a great vessel plunging into the icy foam, now that "old man winter" had dumped a foot of snow crystals on the property obliterating the ground in undulating snow waves.

I opened our air-tight fireplace and saw a thin platform of smoldering red and black embers, and I reached for the poker. As I pushed the dying coals into a pile in the centre and then placed chunks of wood all around, I waited eagerly to see the miracle I had been observing since my youth, and still enjoyed with as much enthusiasm. First the embers turn shimmering bright red as their reflected and concentrated heat warm each other up. And then, one brilliant coal springs into life as a yellow-blue flame ignites. This flame quickly spreads across the bed of coals 'till all are ablaze with a warm and friendly light that seemingly licks its fiery tongue at the fresh wood, causing it to hiss and smoke, like some living being resisting the fire from having its inevitable way. Finally, with the excuses of sap and water discharged as steam, the log submits to the flame and joins the main chorus with a snap and a pop, and great sheets of fire erupt from its side radiating intense heat to the living embers which reflect it back to the wood until the whole fireplace is singing its cheery crackling song. I felt the welcome heat on my face as the fire forced the darkness and cold of the frigid season to retreat.

It is a mystery how Almighty God speaks to His beloved people through His Word and Spirit, but we know that He does! Oh, dear reader, I prayed and prayed that God would show me how to tell you what He wants us to do this year in 1987, and He vividly dropped this illustration into my mind. If we, as Christ's body, continue to struggle on individually without a fresh touch and revelation from God, we will grow cold and ineffective, and the encroaching blast of Satan's "winter" will seize the world, our country and our friends in his icy grasp.

We must, for everyone's good, huddle together in prayer, Bible study and intimate fellowship groups earnestly asking God to send His holy fire and consume us with His dear presence. God has assured me that in every group there are people who will be His "burning bushes", spreading the Divine Flame to the rest of His family. Then, with Christ's "Bride" flashing with the power of God, the lost around us will be more fuel for His Redeeming Fire as the Holy Spirit sears away all objections and ignites them with His love. The forces of Hell will retreat from the high heat of Heaven, and this nation will see the light of God blazing in our souls where the Lord sits enthroned.

Do not say that these are fine and flowery words suitable only for "super saints" and "Christian mystics". I warn all of us from the Word of God, in Proverbs 29:18, that without a continuing fresh revelation and vision from God which we try to obey with our whole being, we will eventually become weak and impotent like the dying coals, unable to reflect any heat, far less set another life on fire for God!

When the Lord formed the F.C.P.O., He showed us this truth: we need to have a deep and godly fellowship that, by sharing the life of the Lord together, would fan into flame a community of believers in law enforcement that would influence for God the course of Canadian history and the lives of many people. This vision is the cry of the loving heart of God Himself. Look around as the Lord is \* raising up Peace Officers and Chapters in every Province, for it is coming to pass! Will  $\underline{YOU}$  be \*an ember plucked from God's "altar", and throw yourself into His transforming fire?

### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

It is very clear as we travel this country of Canada and meet people involved in the Canadian Justice System that the Canadian Fellowship of Christian Peace Officers has become well known. We anticipated at the beginning that we would not be known, and that our organization and the peace officers and their families in it would have to gain credibility amongst our fellow officers in law enforcement and amongst our brothers and sisters in that Christian community.

Since the F.C.P.O.'s inception with a Canada wide thrust beginning in 1980 and our National Incorporation in 1983, I believe that credibility has been established, and many leaders in law enforcement, wardens and chaplains are now aware of our existence, and many look towards us favourably. This should be stated with caution and our guard should be maintained. There are always those who would deliberately seek to destroy and there are those who are tripped up and their reputation destroyed. This does terrible harm to the cause of Christ amongst peace officers, and yet, through all this, our Lord forgives and renews those whose eyes are fixed on Him. We must also keep our eyes fixed on Him for our guidance, growth and protection.

We have so many to thank over these past years, such as David Mainse of 100 Huntley Street, Dr. Paul Smith of The Peoples Church, Jimmy Swaggart, Billy Graham and the Barry Moore Evangelistic Organization who gave us publicity when the C.F.C.P.O. became involved in their crusades across Canada. We are also indebted to the following: to the F.G.B.M.F. and C.B.M.C. organizations; to the Salvation Army; to pastors in large and small congregations who have turned over their pulpits to allow us to minister in word and music; to radio and television stations across Canada; to newspapers, magazines and law enforcement associations who have welcomed our articles; but most of all to all those individuals who have supported us and focused their prayers heavenward on our behalf. Yet I say, like John on the Isle of Patmos, after the Lord said, "Swrely I come qwickly", John's response was "Amen. Even so, come Lord Jesus."

## Recipe Corner

### MOCHA CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIES

3 cups semi-sweet chocolate chips 1/2 cup butter

4 oz. unsweetened chocolate 1/2 cup all purpose flour

1/2 tsp. baking powder

1/2 tsp. salt 4 eggs, room temp.

1-1/2 cups sugar

\* 1-1/2 tsps. instant coffee powder

2 tsp. vanilla

Melt 1-1/2 cups chocolate chips, butter and unsweetened chocolate. Stir until smooth. Preheat oven to 350°F. Line

baking sheets with parchment paper.
 Combine flour, baking powder and salt.
 Set aside. Beat eggs, sugar, coffee

powder and vanilla in large bowl at high speed for 2 minutes. Stir in

chocolate mixture, then flour mixture.

\* Add remaining 1-1/2 cups chocolate chips.

Drop batter onto prepared sheets by tsps. spacing evenly. Bake until cookies are cracked and shiny outside but still

\* soft inside (about 8 minutes). Do not overbake. Cool completely before

\* removing from sheets. Store in airtight container. Makes 7 dozen. Freezes well.
