#### STATEMENT OF FAITH OF THE CFCPO

#### WE BELIEVE CONCERNING:

THE BIBLE: The Scripture of the Old and New Testaments was verbally inspired of God, and inerrant in the original writings, and that they are the supreme and final authority for our faith and life.

**CRACE:** Eternal life is a free gift and cannot be earned. We are saved by grace and not by our own works. (Eph. 2:8,9; Rom. 6:23)

MAN: We are sinners, and that by His death upon the cross, the Lord Jesus Christ made a perfect atomement for sin, redeeming us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse in our place.

(Rom. 3:23; John 3:18; Rom. 10:9,10)

GOD: There is one God, Holy, eternally existing, and manifesting Himself to us in three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. God is merciful and loves us, but is just and must punish sin. (John 14:6 & 10; Exodus 34:7; Matt. 28:9; John 3:16)

CHRIST: Jesus Christ is God incarnate. He was supernaturally conceived, born of a virgin, was put to death by crucifixion under Pontius Pilate, was raised from the dead on the third day, and now sits at the Father's right hand whence He is coming again personally, bodily, and visibly to this earth to inaugurate His millennial reign.

(Luke 1:26-35; 1 Cor. 15:3,4; Rev. 20:1-7; John 1:1,2,14; 15:7)

HOLY SPIRIT: The Holy Spirit is God. He indwells all believers having baptized them into the body of Christ at the time of regeneration. (Rom. 8:9; 1 Cor. 12:13,14; Eph. 1:13; Eph. 4:4,5)

FAITH: All those who by faith receive Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour, and who confess Him as such before their fellowmen become heirs of God and joint heirs with Jesus Christ. (Rom. 10:9,10; Eph. 2:8,9; Rom. 8:16,17)

JUDCMENT: Those who reject the love of God and the saving work of Christ will be judged and punished for sin. They will be eternally separated from God. (John 16:7-11; Psalm 89:32; Exodus 34:7; Jude 14:15, John 3:18)

#### EMBRACED BY THE LIGHT

A miraculous thing happened to me during the conference at Muskoka -- something I will never forget -- a cherished moment in which I saw and felt an expression of God's love for me -- His embrace.

It was the evening of Wednesday, August 29th, 1990, in the chapel at Muskoka Baptist Conference, Ontario. A message on THE PRODIGAL SON from the Gospel of Luke, Chapter 15, was being given by Dr. Roy W. Lawson. The famous story was reviewed, focusing on the father's compassion. The son had requested his share of the estate and then had squandered it in a distant country through wild living. Remorseful and starving, he resolved to return to his father and say, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you ... while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion for him; he ran to his son, threw his arms around him and kissed him."

(Luke 15:18-20 N.I.V.)

Imagine, the congregation was asked, that all the sins of each person there could be projected onto a large movie screen for all of us to see. What a horrible thought! The point being made was not that we weren't forgiven through the suffering of Christ, and the acceptance of Him as Saviour and Lord: It was that perhaps we had forgotten the magnitude of our sin, forgetting also the magnitude of God's mercy and compassion.

The cherished moment came when my eyes were closed in prayer at the end of the message. I was feeling so remorseful about my sins and so thankful to God for forgiving me -- thinking about the father running to meet the prodigal son. I saw, against a background of darkness, large circles of light coming toward me. Each one passed through me to encircle me. I had an indescribable feeling of comfort, as if my body had never before known warmth of the perfect temperature. I felt so good that I wanted the experience to go on forever. After a few seconds, it was over.

I believe this was a loving embrace from God: His miraculous way of assuring me that, at that moment in time, my attitude before Him was absolutely right. A wonderful experience it was, but only one of many signs given to Christians during their lives.

In this <u>Peacemaker</u>, you will find people being referred to as "unsaved." You will find we are praying that they will come to a "saving knowledge of Christ." In the lunch room the other day, I heard a fellow officer exclaim, "Praise the Lord; I'm saved!" I could see he was joking. But I'm serious! That's why I tell of my personal experience and join other Christians praising our Father in heaven "... who wants all men to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth. For there is one God and one mediator between God and men,the man Christ Jesus,who gave himself as a ransom for all men..." (1 Tim. 2:4-6 N.I.V.)

The writer from Arizona State Prison said (Page 17, this issue), "... without Christ we are all guilty before the Lord. You might say that we are all criminals outside of Jesus Christ." Let us recognize our sins, realize our need of forgiveness, repent, and lean on the everlasting arms of Jesus. In this world of darkness, He is the Light, longing to embrace us!

Reading the book, I found a man who falls into the category of thousands of people between 20 and 50 years of age who are intelligent by the world's standards, are mixed up mentally, have encountered many of the problems associated with this lifestyle such as drinking, drugs, bad associations with the opposite sex, attempts at suicide, poor marriages, and of course, most of all a lack of acknowledgement of Jesus Christ as the One who came to save them (Continued on Page 14)

and love them and die for them. Dan Wakefield writes the book. The whole book is about "religion" per se, but he cannot bring himself around to the most important decision of his life. When I read the story, I thanked God for opening my eyes, even at a late age: 61 years. I could not help but think that even now, as Dan is still young compared to me (71), God will seek him out and fill the most vital need of his heart and soul.

The other book is about the latest crisis in Iraq. It is a well written book by Charles H. Dyer called THE RISE OF BABYLON -- which also deals with its fall. It will give Christians a lift, to go out and give the reason for our belief in God to a lost society, in our case peace officers in particular, as that may be our particular calling. We are a strong arm of the Church, preaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The last chapter of the book emphasizes that mission. It is a book everyone should read. It is current and relevant and based on His Holy Word, our Bible. Both books come out of respected publishing houses.

We had an FCPO meeting in Largo last night, January 28th, and heard Deputy Sheriff Bruce Rahar enlarge on the Beatitudes (Matthew 5). Many of our officers all over Canada and the U.S. are conducting Bible studies such as this, and to me this is most encouraging in a world that is aching to hear the true Gospel. There were several Canadians at the meeting along with our friends and executive members of the CFCPO, Jack and Ruth Foster. We fellowship with them regularly through our church here, First Indian Rocks Baptist with Pastor Charlie Martin — the preacher who tells it as it is — right from the Bible. We need more churches like this all over North America. Praise God for leading my wife and me to this one. What fellowship and witness, with genuine friendship and concern for each other.

#### MEET THE EXECUTIVE

We were all born in Alberta to Christian parents. I grew up on a farm about 130 km northeast of Edmonton (a little town called Newbrook). After graduating from high school, I attended one year of Bible school at Prairie Bible Institute, Three Hills, Alberta. I then worked in the oilfield for several years out of Edmonton. I met Hilde in 1969 at a church social and at her suggestion joined the Edmonton Police Service in 1970.

Hilde and I have been a part of the boys and girls clubs, adult fellowship, the elders board and Evangelism Explosion. Currently I am an usher, a high school youth sponsor, part of an EE team, and sit on the Evangelism/Discipleship Committee.

Pioneer Bible Camp, an evangelical, non-denominational children's camp located just a few km from my parents' farm, has been a great part of our spiritual journey. I accepted the Lord there as a child of eight years. Our youngest daughter accepted the Lord there at the age of five. Hilde and I have spent at least one camp week there for the past thirteen years working as sports director, lifeguard, cabin counsellors, class teachers, registrar, etc. Again we thank God when we see our daughters stepping right into leadership roles there.

CFCPO has been inspirational to us. I have had the pleasure in attending three national conferences: 1987 near Toronto, 1989 in Alberta, and this past August at Muskoka, Ontario. If at all possible, you must attend the next conference. It gives one encouragement, a challenge, and a further commitment after fellowshipping in God's presence with fellow officers and families from not only across Canada, but also the USA, Scotland and Wales this last year.

I want to close off this document by giving God all the praise and glory for what He has given us and allowed us to be a part of. In no way do I want to take any credit. I have not earned it nor do I deserve it. Truly God is most gracious, all forgiving and kind. And I thank Him for the privilege of being able to work with you fellow Christians in His vineyard. May we be cognizant of and faithful to His will.

#### LETTER OF ENCOURAGEMENT FROM ARIZONA STATE PRISON

The following letter was received in December, 1990. It was addressed to our good friend and former <a href="Peacemaker">Peacemaker</a> editor, Norm Brown, who has moved on from the Metro Toronto Police Force to counselling with the Institute of Family Living in Toronto. It was a real pleasure to visit with Norm & Sharon recently. Their prayers are with us and we know that they are encouraged by this letter just as we are:

Dear Brother Brown,

Choice greetings in Christ Jesus! I ran across your address in the Canadian Almanac Directory some time ago and for some reason the Lord would have me write you a letter.

... The Lord needs servants in every area of specific vocations. I know police work must be tough and can probably become quite frustrating at times. I'm sure every law abiding citizen gets fed up with crime which may cause them to become very bitter towards criminals ... But inspite of what anyone says, I praise God that in Christ Jesus the barriers have come down. What is really amazing is when we discover that without Christ we are all guilty before the Lord. You might say we are all criminals outside of Jesus Christ. It is (Continued on Page 18)

awesome to think that we were each personally responsible for Christ's terrible death and suffering upon the cross. I am very grateful that the Lord had mercy upon me, particularly when I had done so much wrong. In every one of my victims was my Lord, yet I was too blinded by my sins to see or care about anyone else. My selfishness would have consumed me if it were not for the love and mercy of God.

I am presently incarcerated at the Arizona State Prison, Winslow, serving a ten year sentence for the crime of armed robbery. However, I want you to know that this is the best thing that could have happened. It was the Lord's way of "arresting" my attention and giving me another chance. I feel so blessed to have this time to spend in His Word and sharing His love with all here who will listen.

Praise the Lord! It is absolutely amazing what the Lord can do for us if we will but seek after and follow Him. (Jer. 29:13) Brother Brown, although we have never met face to face, I want you to know that I love you because of Jesus and I want very much to encourage you in the Lord. May our Lord Jesus Christ shine brightly through you (Gal. 2:20), as He draws others to Himself through you. You are much loved in the Lord and are very precious to Him.

Greetings to my brothers and sisters up there in Canada!
