## **EDITORIAL**

The Webster's New Twentieth Century Dictionary's theological definition of "ELEC-TION" is; a "divine choice by God, by which persons are distinguished as objects of mercy, become subjects of grace, are sanctified and prepared



sanctified, and prepared for eternal life in heaven." It is also the act of choosing a person to fill an office or position by a vote.

It is a fundamental right of everyone to choose. It expresses the idea of deliberately selecting someone or something after carefully considering the alternatives. Many of those ideas are in the Old Testament. For example, 1 Sam. 18:40, a sling shot; a wife in Gen. 6:2; good rather than evil, Isa. 7:15; life rather than death, Deut. 30:19; the service of God rather than idols, Jos. 24:22.

# Why should we vote?

The New Bible Dictionary suggests that the development of the idea of election is found in the Epistles of Paul and especially refers to Rom. 8:28; Eph. 1:3-14; 1 Thes. 1:2-10; 2 Thes. 2:13-14; 2 Tim. 1:9-10. Having examined the references made, Paul does present divine election as a gracious, sovereign, eternal choice of individual sinners to be saved and glorified in and through Christ.

Consider again. Election "is a gracious choice; it is a sovereign choice; it is an eternal choice."

We are required by law to have annual elections of our national and local chapter executives. But, the question that troubles those holding office is, who will participate by standing for office and who will exercise their choice by voting in a new executive? How we get involved is our choice, but it is necessary that we make the choice.

Please get involved by voting when you receive the notice for election or reelection.

For local chapters, elections are usually held in June and our national executive in late

# TIPS FROM A CRIME PREVENTION OFFICER

y husband used to work as a Crime Prevention Officer. The ideas for this article are his. I have simply put the words around the ideas. All references are from the New American Standard Bible.

How we protect our families is very important, both spiritually and physically. Companies, church groups and community groups frequently invite Crime Prevention officers to teach their people how to protect their homes, property, and their own bodies. But how much time and energy do we devote to the spiritual protection of our homes and to ourselves. Here are some suggestions.

# Be careful what is outside your door.

Genesis 4:7 "If you do well, will not your countenance be lifted up? And if you do not do well, sin is crouching at the door; and its desire is for you, but you must master it."

Every year, early in January, I am struck by this verse. God was speaking with Cainhere, before Cain killed his brother Abel. Cain obviously did not heed God's warning. How about you? Do you pay attention to what lurks outside your life?

# Paint your door-posts the right color.

Exodus 12:23 "For the Lord will pass through to smite the Egyptians; and when He sees the blood on the lintel and on the two doorposts, the Lord will pass over the door and will not allow the destroyer to come in to your houses to smite you."

Even today the Jewish people still celebrate Passover, in commemoration of that time in Egypt when they painted the doorposts with the blood of a perfect lamb so they would be protected from death. Is your life, and your home, protected by Jesus' blood?

#### Are you using the right door?

In John 10:9-10 Jesus calls himself "the door".

"I (Jesus) am the door; if anyone enters through Me, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal, and kill, and destroy; I came that they might have life, and might have it abundantly." Jesus is the only door through which we can have access to eternal life. Be sure you are using this door.

#### Who do you let into your house?

Revelation 3:20 "Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if anyone hears My voice and opens the door, I will come in to him, and will dine with him, and he with Me."

Jesus is speaking here. He is the best guest we could possibly let into our hearts and our homes.

#### Protect your windows.

It has been said that the eyes are the windows of the soul. Windows can be used for both looking out of, and looking into, and so can our eyes. Our eyes may show others much about us, but we must be very careful what we let in through our eyes. This reminds me of Romans 12:2 which tells us to "...be transformed by the renewing of your mind..." A lot of what affects my mind gets there through my eyes and my ears. Be careful about what you watch on TV and videos; what you read; what magazines you look at.

#### Protect your belongings.

Put your "stuff" where it will be safe. Matthew 6:19 says: "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures upon earth, where moth and rust destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in or steal; for where your treasure is, there will your heart be also."

# How To Pray?

n continuation with our theme on prayer we will examine the ten sections outlined in brother Bob Grimbly's study.

- 1. "Our Father..." Jesus established a relationship of love between the believer and his God. Just as an earthly father is easy to entreat, so the heavenly Father listens and loves.
- 2. "In Heaven, hallowed be Your name..." While God is our Father, He still is God and deserves our respect. By recognizing His position, we recognize His ability to assist us far beyond the help of any earthly father. Therefore, Christ taught us early in each prayer to pause and thank God for that relationship recognizing His great glory.
- 3. "... Your kingdom come..." This world has been wrecked by the havoc of Satan. Christ teaches us to pray that His Kingdom will come in the hearts of men and on the face of this earth. Christians everywhere should pray daily for Christ's Kingdom to come.
- 4. "...Your will be done on earth, as it is in heaven..." For some eternal reason God has tied His hands on earth. He has involved us in the redemptive process. Therefore, each prayer should be one imploring God to bring forces to bear on this earth, so men will be responsive to His will.
- 5. "...Give us this day, our daily bread..." God desires we ask Him each day for our daily needs. Often we reluctantly ask God for material blessings. Yet, in the prayer Christ taught us to pray, it is very clear the Father desires this type of petition. Many Old Testament saints understood this premise. The Psalmist prayed..." O Lord, I pray send now prosperity" (Ps 118:25).
- 6. "...And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors..." We have already seen how our forgiveness is predicted on our ability to forgive. This part of the prayer Christ taught simply calls attention to our moral duty toward the family of man.
- 7. "...And lead us not into temptation..." While the spirit is willing, the flesh is weak. Christ teaches us to pray that we escape temptation; while we might stand the test of

- trial, Jesus taught here that we should desiredeliverance from the test if possible.
- 8. "...But deliver us from evil..." Almost in the same breath this prayer follows the preceding thought. Here we are praying for complete deliverance from that evil one, who has chocked our world to its knees and bred hatred and war among mankind. This is also another plea for that Kingdom to come, to set man and creation free. Our daily cry is that the agony of this earth be shortened and our Lord returns.
- 9. "...For yours is the Kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever..." Jesus now comes to the full circle of prayer. Note, this prayer began with praise, and now concludes with it. While the evil one does have power, still we recognize "...He who is in you is greater than he who is in the world" (1John 4:4). Here we express the confidence that ultimately evil will be conquered and Christ will reign forever and ever.
- 10. "...Amen" This final note in the Lord's prayer is one of confidence that the Lord has heard us. We do not speak to empty air. Rather, we have the Divine assurance that what we ask in Christ's name will be done. Thus, a resounding "Amen" fills the end of our prayer.



# "The Foundation of Commitment"

we not (yet) heard God in an audible voice, but His message rings clear as He makes Himselfmanifest through His word, still-smallvoice as His Spirit speaks to mine and through circumstances as well as other believers.

When I listen, He answers. When I fail to pay attention, I miss that which He has for me. Some of the best such opportunites occur on first watch, alone during the night hours. Cops really do need to recognize His presence as they are by no means "alone" at any time lest they choose to be; it is after all His promise never to leave or forsake His children!

Over the course of three night shifts, the Lord found a way to prompt me to re-focus on the relevance, indeed the absolute necessity of my need to have Him continue the primary role in my calling as a police officer. He must increase - I must decrease.

Some months prior, I'd been working through a daily devotional book published by Chuck Swindoll. Central in one lesson was an "adaptation" focussing upon the love chapter, 1 Corinthians 13. It was written by an anonymous missionary, place and time unknown. But I was struck by how he/she had without attention to the clear meaning and essence of the passage, "internalized" the truth of the words and had expanded them in a way which brought the meaning into direct relationship with his/her special ministry.

So when I read it, I too felt challenged to make those verses mine in exactly the same way. God heard and answered; I wrote and prayed at His direction. The result is an "adaptation" emphasizing for me, the foundation of commitment which God and the ministry of police work demands of me (and I trust each of you!). The first focus is a personal one for me; I'm the one who needs to "live" what the words speak. But I am prompted to share it with you because I'm reasonably confident there are

others who, like me, just want to "DO IT RIGHT" and be found faithful.

May our Lord and Saviour quicken your hearts and challenge you afresh concerning His desires and expectations of you.

The population of about 3500 consists of a mixture of Inuits and whites. The detachment has about fourteen members and the work is abundant, unfortunately. The majority of our files revolve around drugs, assaults or sexual assaults. It is understandable however, as Inuit culture, up until about 10 years ago felt that inter family relations were perfectly acceptable.

In Sanikiluaq, abuse has destroyed a whole generation of young men. They are all about





mid-twenties and are the most violent offenders. The majority are either in the Federal Penitentiaries or else they are dead. The few that remain of that age group are in constant trouble.

For the month of September, I was given the chance to be a relief court member. It was a challenge I enjoyed, but one that made me commit all into the Lord's hands. In the Eastern Arctic, the Justice Department suffers from lack of personnel. As a result, all C.C. charges are set for Territorial court and then sent back to the Justice of the Peace Court for prosecution by the police court member. It took a lot of prayer and preparation to walk into court and go up against the defence lawyers, but as one can expect of our Lord, He never fails us.

I have learned over the last year that the Lord's forgiveness and grace far surpasses what we can imagine. He has taken my sin and my failure and turned it into such blessing. 

# GREATER VANCOUVER CHAPTER

he last few weeks have been very rewarding in the Lord's service. I recently participated in a ministry team to Romania. A hectic schedule saw us ministering about 18 times in 14 days, often in small village churches. The churches would be packed with local residents curious about the "Canadians." A conservative estimate is that well over 400 met Jesus. In street meetings held in Arad and Zalau, many who came to know the Lord were visibly weeping, as the Holy Spirit moved amongst the crowd.

It was a surprise to find that no one had even heard of a Christian Police Officer. Rather than hear preaching, the assemblies wanted to hear a testimony of the saving power of Jesus in police work. They marvelled at the idea of an actual fellowship of Christian Officers. Highlights of the trip included seeing a Romanian police officer accept Christ in Huenedoara, and a high ranking military officer accept Christ in Zalau.

Despite Romania still being under communist Government, the country is now open to the Gospel. There is a sovereign historic move of God in that Nation. Along with medical supplies, we took in Romanian New Testaments. These are in short supply mostly for economic reasons. Despite the poverty of the church we were treated with great hospitality. We also saw several new churches and others under construction. In Prague, Czechoslovakia, we met with a minister who has just purchased property for a Bible school in Czechoslovakia.
