ME BELIEVE

JUDGEMENT: Those who reject the love of God and the saving work of Christ will be judged and punished for sin. They will be eternally separated from God (John 16:7-11; Psalm 89:32; Exodus 34:7; Jude 14:15; John 3:18).

In September, 1990, the National Executive grasped a vision to see the CFCPO revitalized across the nation. Many chapters had ceased to function while others progressed slowly with no central direction and unity.

The vision is to select and appoint "PROVINCIAL REPRESENTATIVES" responsible for the care and maintenance of FCPO chapters in their respective provinces. To encourage local chapters and report to the National Executive. The goal is to see inactive chapters reactivated and supported through regular contact and fellowship and also to oversee and promote new chapters.

To date there have been Provincial Representatives appointed in British Columbia, the Western Provinces and Quebec. I am the Provincial Representative for Ontario. I cannot do the job alone. Ontario is too vast for me to cover alone. I seek your assistance in establishing "AREA REPRESENTATIVES" within the province of Ontario. This way, the load can be shared by many. I ask you to consider being an "Area Representative" for your area. I will send you maps detailing your local active and inactive chapters. I will also provide *Peacemakes** magazine mailing lists that may help you in establishing new contacts or chapters in your area.

Area Representative Job Description

- 1. Contact existing chapters and encourage them.
- 2. Encourage defunct chapters to re-activate.
- 3. Coordinate special events (pizza nights, peace officer appreciation services, music nights, testimony breakfast etc.).
- 4. Attempt to contact people in your area

who received *Peacemaker* magazines but moved with no forwarding address. The goal is to reinstate them to the *Peacemaker* list.

We need your help now! Please contact me as soon as you can so I can establish the Ontario Provincial network from north to south and east to west.




