## Judgement



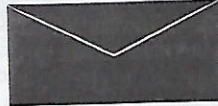

Some "people" came up and attempted to take the child saying that they "knew" the parents. The police would not release the girl until they made positive I.D. Finally a frantic father came running down from his apartment and gladly took the child from the very upset policewoman. That reunion brought tears to the eyes of those hardened street wise policemen.

Without a moments hesitation Chris gave each officer a tract telling them about a heavenly Father that sent His son Jesus Christ into a sin sick world to

# Behind the Badge

Ontario Police Journal



The Ontario Police College in Aylmer, Ontario has become an almost tangible force influencing, as it does, the careers of almost every officer in this province. It follows, therefore, that the unique symbol of this institution has become almost as familiar to all police officers as their own departments, yet few know of its origin or how it came into existence.

In the basement custody area of the Hamilton-Wentworth Regional Police Headquarters building, labours a certain officer working behind badge number 226. His outward appearance suggests that in an earlier life he might have been either a very substantial piece of the Rock of Gibraltar or at least a gladiator who survived the Roman arena. In actual fact, in this life. (and prior to becoming a police officer), P.C. #226 was a gladiator of sorts in that for several years he wrestled professionally under the sobriquet of "HURRICANE SMITH" often in tandem with his brother "CYCLONE".

P.C. Robert Harry Grimby, despite his formidable, somewhat craggy exterior, is both a gentle man and a gentleman, his present and past occupations notwithstanding.

During his off-duty hours, he is given to the pleasures of hearth and home, and may usually be found in the company of his wife, Betty, during the summer months at their cottage in Bobcaygeon, or in his basement workshop designing and constructing children's games or household "gadgets" as he prefers to call them. He is a private man. As with most "Rookies" during the first few months of their police careers, Bob was ordered to attend the

Ontario Police College, and since this institution was also in its "Rookie" years, Bob was enrolled in only its second series of classes, back in 1962. The Director of the College, Mr. Joseph Mennill wanted a distinctive crest, badge or logo created for the infant institution, and a contest, open to all who attended that second series of courses, was held. Bob submitted six ideas and as you may have already surmised, he won both First and Second Prizes for two of his designs.

As Bob recalls now, prior to the final Inspection Parade, the Director regretted the fact that missing from the prizes Bob was to receive during the ceremony was a royalty contract for his design which was to become the symbol of the college. (Had such a royalty contract existed, Bob could have retired long ago from the sales of T-shirts alone!) For his creative efforts, Bob was awarded a cheque for fifteen dollars, a new "Martin's" Criminal Code, a copy of McGowan's Police Officers Handbook, and a gold wire blazer crest of his winning design.

So dear reader, the next time you sit down to write a set of promotional exams as set by the College or visit the (now) hallowed halls of this fine institution and notice the hat badge, or shoulder flash of an instructor remember this story of the "Tank Captain", here in Hamilton, for Bob Grimby is the man "behind the badge".

I was accepted as a recruit into the Winnipeg Police Department on January 5, 1981. Out of over two thousand applicants I was one of the fortunate forty three for CLASS #99.

As a committed Christian I knew why God had allowed me to be on the police department. Without a doubt, I was there to share God's love and minister to the police officers of the Winnipeg Police Department.

I was confident in my Christian walk. Oh, I had my problems, my sins, that reared their ugly heads now and again. In my own strength I was weak; afraid of ridicule, of not "fitting in", but each time I relied on His strength (does that remind you of a scripture verse?), things took a turn for the better.

After training, I was assigned to a division and began the most exciting and challenging job I had ever been in. I worked the three shifts...days, evenings and nights. Over twelve years now I have worked in the slowest and in the busiest districts. I have been assigned to general patrol, traffic, detectives, back to general patrol, and finally to "WHY" God put me here in the first place!!!

Sure, I had plenty of opportunities to "witness" and "let my light shine". Yes, a few officers did accept Christ. But nothing prepared me for what God had in store, approximately one year ago. It started with a phone call from a Sergeant, asking if I would be interested in a police Chaplaincy program, the department was

just starting. Would I? I tried to contain my excitement. Further inquiries revealed "they" were looking for two officers to take a course offered at "Providence College" (old Winnipeg Bible College). "Tailor" made for police Chaplains, to be taught by Dr. Phil Taylor. They would pay for the course and books required. My partner would be another evangelical Sergeant, Dallas Williams. We completed the course, and received our certificates six months later. Okay, I received an A-, but I have no other theological training. The department requested that both of us be supported by our local church and become "Ordained." I am in my second licence for ordination.

Now the exciting part. The police department requested I wear two large crosses on my collar (one on each side). Remember, this is a police department that for seventy years has only had as its official religious wing the Salvation Army; who showed up to say the benediction at recruit graduations. No fault of theirs, because this was all the police department would allow, or could handle.

Suddenly it was "okay" to be religious. The announcement even came out in the police notices; the new police chaplains would be available to marry, bury, baptize and relate to all faiths. I had complete freedom to minister to any police officer. Was I excited, stupefied and amazed, "YES"!

And He isn't finished yet. A few months ago I was asked to come off general patrol and to work as a COMMUNITY CONSTABLE in the downtown area. Do you know what that means? Of course you don't. It means, NO MORE NIGHTS, EVERY WEEKEND OFF, STRAIGHT DAYS. Freedom to move about within the department, meet with those in crisis, and reach out to police officers and their families. As I write this, I sit amazed at His timing, blessing and love for this sinner, saved by Grace.

In closing, let me say, many doors have opened that were closed, none



have closed that were open.

Dallas and I are starting a Marriage Enrichment group to meet every Saturday for police officers and their wives. I shall let you know what happens.

Thanks for letting me share this good news, in a world full of the other.

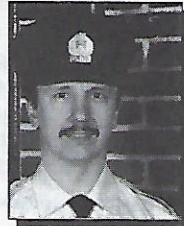

# Dear Heavenly Father

Remember me? I know we haven't talked lately. I've been hiding again. You what I'm like when something's bothering me. I avoid the people close to me, the very people who could help me sort things out, who could help face the truth and deal with it. Oh, I've got lots of excuses for keeping to myself: I don't want to burden others with my problems; I don't want to talk to someone who doesn't understand what I'm going through; I don't want others to think I can't handle things on my own. But if I'm really honest I have to admit that I enjoy wallowing in self-pity, in a perverse sort of way. Then again, I'm also a little afraid of facing up to what You might show me about myself, something I don't want to know about me, that doesn't fit with the image I try to portray.

Silly isn't it? When will I ever learn that my problems are not so special, they're not unique, they're certainly not too difficult for You to handle, if only I would give them up to You. It's not like You don't already know about them. After all, nothing - absolutely nothing - is hidden from You. You know my heart and my deepest, darkest secrets, things I may not even admit to myself. What can I possibly gain by keeping things to myself?

You used a conversation with my mother recently to show me that even when I think I'm hiding things from those around me, people close to me know. And things that I'm only just beginning to learn about myself, others have known for years. How

much more so with You? As Mom and I talked about the past, the things I've been through, the lessons I'm finally learning from them, how many times did Mom say, 'your father and I knew that' or 'that's what we thought'? Yet because I was so fiercely independent, so unwilling to admit failure or ask for help, they couldn't 'interfere' to offer their help or support. They knew from experience that any discussion they initiated would be met with hostility and withdrawal on my part, so they waited in vain for me to take the initiative and come to them.

It's like that with You, isn't it, Lord? You know me better than I know myself. You know exactly what's bothering me, even if I don't, and You know exactly how to deal with it, if only I would ask. You've given each of us the right to make our own decisions, and so You wait for us to come to You, lest we don't appreciate Your help. John Bunyan described it this way, in *Pilgrim's Progress*. "It is not always necessary to grant things not asked for, lest by so doing they become of little esteem; but when the want of a thing is felt, it then comes under, in the eyes of him that feels it, that estimate that properly is its due, and so consequently will be thereafter used."

I've learned this lesson many times, yet I still persist in trying to deal with things in my own strength and my own wisdom, such as it is. Each time I learn anew that if I humble myself and come before You, You will hear my prayer. Lord, grant that I not be a victim of my own pride, but that I might bring all things before You, confessing my own weakness and asking for Your strength, wisdom and courage to handle each situation before me. *"Search me, O God, and know my heart, test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting"* (Psalm 139:23-24).

# What is your Vision?

"How are you today? and you respond 'fine thanks' or 'I'm well, thank you very much.' But often, we say that rather lightly or tritely" said Chief Grant Waddell, of the Niagara Regional Police Force, in his opening remarks to FCPO and supporters, at the May 29 breakfast.

Chief Waddell is a Christian who has a great responsibility in a high profile position. He attributes this as the leading of God in his life. His challenge to us on "Vision" and "Wellness" is evident of his own experience and faith in the word of God.

In dealing with the issue of vision, he reminded us of a true story of Sir Winston Churchill who in Britain's darkest hour said "don't despair I am planning the invasion of Europe." Churchill was a leader with vision who was able to rally his people at a particular time and gave them some cause for hope. He also shared about a Roman Catholic priest named Father Jersey who, at the request of the steel workers in Gdansk, ministered to them and encouraged them, "not men of diplomacy and political correctness" he said, but men who had a yearning in their hearts for freedom, in the very early days of Eastern Europe. Father Jersey became



a martyr to a cause, he had vision but did not live to see the walls of Berlin falling down or his nation becoming free. But he saw in the early days, the hope, a little flame and a little candle of freedom that was burning bright.

Referring to Proverbs 29:18a, he said "without vision, men perish." "For I have in my own experience seen a vision in a particular ministry and a particular avenue of work and have followed that dream and have created something of value, something of lasting, goodness that will far outlive them and therefore they have extolled this particular virtue of vision."

The "wellness" factor was the second point in his address. "The wellness factors are not from Grant Waddell, they are from a female doctor, Jo Cannon of UCLA."

He cautioned us to do our "own checks and balances" as he talked about the seven factors of "wellness" in the following order.

## # 7 "ECONOMIC ESSENTIALS"

is at the bottom of the scale. He noted in times of social contracts, in the midst of all the problems of financing and governments, he asked; "do you have a shirt on your back, bread on the table, a roof over your head?"

## # 6 "STRESS". He quoted

the baseball player, Casey Stengel who said "the future ain't what it used to be" (with a shout of laughter

from the audience) "and isn't it the truth, it's not quite the way we thought it was going to be, but how are you dealing with that?"

## # 5 "WORK SATISFACTION" There

is an expression these days that somebody has an attitude and it is given a derogatory connotation, "this guy's got an attitude." "The Word tells us to be a good worker for the Master" he said. The Chief believes that he has no more power, no more authority

than the youngest constable on the job and would suggest that the attitude should not be status, wealth, grandeur or rank but all the work that we do, that we are seized with, that is our privilege to have, should be done for the Master.

**# 3 'POSITIVE SELF ESTEEM'** He suggested that if he were to ask ministers, psychiatrists, medical practitioners and psychologists, what is the one common denominator they have found in dealing with their patients, a fair amount would say 'it seems to be a bit of, or lack of self esteem that comes through.'

**# 2 'PHYSICAL FITNESS'** Are you exercising, getting enough rest, looking after that body that has been given to you for a time?

**# 1 'FULFILLING RELATIONSHIPS'** 'How are things at home, with the kids and yourself, between you and your spouse, the extended family and how are things with your God?', he asked.

There is an expression he told us that came to him forcibly since moving away from the big metropolis 'that in some of our society we know the price of everything and the value of nothing. The things which are meaningful, good, wholesome, of eternal significance of much deeper relevance than all of the other material, unfortunately gets shoved so far to the side that it sometimes slips off.'

As I listened to the Chief, I found myself looking to the cross and realizing that Jesus Christ had a vision in what the Chief called 'deliverance day.'

Neville and Mona Eccleston sang about it in their song 'above every name' and I kept thinking that I claimed that deliverance in my life and thought about those who didn't. As a result, my attitude changed and I too had a new vision, a vision in Christ.

Chief Waddell reminded us that we as peace officers have a 'special place in the economy of God' but he said something which made me think, since I had never heard it quite like this before, that police officers and correctional officers were

the ones who took Christ to the cross, who got out the dice and marked down the scores, who took part in the scourging, who made fun of the robe and crown of thorns. 'In a sense, it was our hereditary colleagues and we're not proud of that' he said.

He made reference to others such as the Centurion, when Jesus said in Mark 8:10; 'I have never found faith like this, even in Israel.' Those who were present at the cross to hear Him say 'forgive them for they know not what they do' and those who kept guard at the tomb.

'The battalions of God are far larger, far more infinite than any battalion that ever marched, Roman or military army of any kind. Many of them finished the course and may have heard the 'well done' and they await us. Tomorrow can be a day of victory for every person because deliverance day has happened, deliverance day is happening right now.'

He said 'today, do not be uncommitted, today do not be apathetic, let us not, ladies and gentlemen somber into the sunset rather let us take up our cross, His cross and march with our faces to the sun, victors with Him in our relationship.'

Of the wellness factors, all seven of them, relationship is the most important one and at the end of the journey to hear His 'well done.'

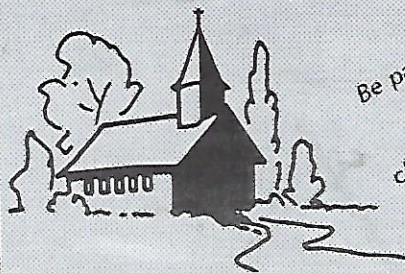

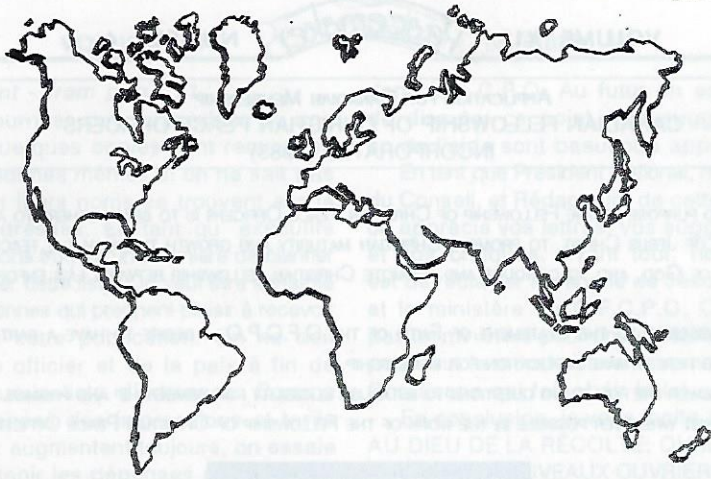
