TRIBUTE TO TODD BAYLIS

On Wednesday, June 22nd, my wife and I were among the approximately 10,000 people who attended the funeral of our fallen officer Todd Baylis #114, who had been gunned down a few days earlier. I would like to give my impression as I stood and watched for nearly three hours.

It was about fifty years ago when a group of young men, fresh out of the Services and considered to be the "cream of the crop" were hired on to the vastly understaffed Toronto Police Department.

Today, as we peered over the parade of young men and women in uniform, one could feel that time was being repeated in our minds. For sure, these are truly today's "cream of the crop". We were very proud and tearful as the service progressed.

All of the participants, the young officer who paid a tribute to his buddy Todd, the girl who sang Amazing Grace so beautifully, the aunt who read the touching poem, Todd's wounded partner who carried his cap into the church, Rev. Bob Rumball who gave an inspirational message of the hope that lies within us of eternal life, and His servant Rev. Norman Wylie of the Bayview Glen Alliance Church where the service was held, confirmed very clearly where we all stand before a Holy God.

As the National Secretary of the Canadian Fellowship of Christian Peace Officers, I know many officers had come from many places in the U.S. and other countries to pay their deepest respects to the Baylis family for the loss of their dear son and fine police officer Todd, on this very sad day for our police.

However it was most comforting to feel the love and care of the citizens of this great city and read the reporters' accounts in the media and TV news.

These are the thoughts of one War Vet and past serving officer of the Metropolitan Toronto Police Force. I speak for all men of my time. God bless each and every one at that service.


