Most recently in the case of Ernie Frers' serious accident, Mitch provided the message updates throughout Canada and the world on Ernie's progress and the need for prayer.

On September 5th we were shocked to hear that the Lord had called Mitch home. We grieve his loss for Ruth, his wife, their family and for our Fellowship, but praise God for Mitch's final promotion, to Glory. Jack Turner, Dick Hayward and all the way from Scotland, Bert Sharp, representing the F.C.P.F. and the C.P.A., and I attended his funeral. We met with many of the Ottawa chapter members and wondered what would happen to the chapter now that such a void had been left. That was until I had a call from the interim Ottawa Chapter President Dave Stewart just recently. What a thrill to

hear from such a spiritual man who, in spite of the many challenges in his life, is spearheading the cause of the local chapter and defending the Nepean Police chapel issue in the Ottawa-Carlton Police (prayer item: more about this in a later issue). Dave related to me what an impact Mitch Bell, A.D. McConnell and Doug Seabrook had made in his life. Their commitment, wisdom and knowledge have left a Godly legacy in the work of the Ottawa-Carlton Region. Bill VanRyswyk, a Constable in Ottawa I met at the funeral also described the positive impact of these elder statesmen.

We can learn volumes from the experience, dedication and commitment of those among us who are our retired law enforcement veterans. Long time members like Jack Turner, Mitch Bell, A.D. McConnell, Jack Foster, Harold Bennett, Bill Marten, Wayne Eaton, Bruce Day and the dear woman who makes all the calls for the Surrey Chapter,...to name only a few, provide us with life lessons on why the Fellowship of Christian Peace Officers once flourished with 32 chapters nationally. I hasten to say that these blessed people will not be with us forever so we must take advantage of their passion and wisdom to "Carry the Torch" and "Refuse to Lose" for the cause of Christ in law enforcement.

The same week of Mitch's funeral I was blessed with my first conversation with Ernie Frers since his accident. I can't express what joy I felt in hearing my dear brother's voice over the phone. It was like the friends of Lazarus must have felt in first experiencing their resurrected friend. Ernie summed the situation up best when he stated to me, "GOD IS STILL ON THE THRONE!" Since his exit from the hospital he has made much progress, and has visited the fledgling Vancouver Chapter to give his testimony.

Ernie is a lesson to us of the F.C.P.O. that God assumes all responsibility for removing obstacles and hindrances that get in the way of His will for our lives. This can be illustrated so profoundly in Zechariah 4 when

the prophet exclaims to Zerubbabel, "What are you mighty mountain before Zerubbabel you will become level ground." (4:7). Zerubbabel had been called by God to build the tabernacle for God. He was faced with imposing physical obstructions, overwhelming odds, and opposition from without and within the Jewish nation. We too face all obstacles and challenges (4:6), "Not by might nor by power but by My Spirit says the Lord Almighty". It is essential that we fuel our fight with the power that is contained within the heart of every believer, the power of the Holy Spirit. That power is ours for the taking, it is unfortunate that so many Christians obstruct this power and so seldom realize the benefits and victorious existence of the Spirit's indwelling in their lives.

I am a mother of three (ages 14, 12, 3) and have recently completed my college degree. The last class I had was Sociology. The teacher was absolutely inspiring with the qualities that I wish every human being had been graced with. Her last project of the term was called "Smile." The class was asked to go out and smile at three people and document their reaction. I am a very friendly person and always smile at everyone and say, hello anyway. So, I thought, this would be a piece of cake, literally.

Soon after we were assigned the project, my husband, youngest son and I went out to McDonalds one crispy morning. It was just our way of sharing special play time with our son. We were standing in line, waiting to be served, when all of a sudden people around us began to back away. I did not move an inch. An overwhelming feeling of panic welled up inside of me as I turned to see why they had moved. As I turned around I smelt a horrible "dirty body" smell, and there standing behind me were two poor homeless men.

I looked down at the short gentleman, close to me. He was "smiling". His beautiful sky blue eyes were full of God's Light as he searched for acceptance. He said, "Good day" as he counted the few coins he had been clutching. The second man fumbled with his hands as he stood behind his friend. I realized the second man was mentally deficient and the blue eyed man was his salvation. I held my tears as I stood there with them.

The young lady at the counter asked him what they wanted. He said, "Coffee is all Miss". (to sit in the restaurant and warm up, they had to buy something...they just wanted to be warm).

Then I really felt it. The compulsion was so great I almost reached out and embraced the little man with the blue eyes. That is when I noticed all eyes in the restaurant were set on me. I smiled and asked the young lady behind the counter to give me two more breakfast meals on a separate tray. I then walked around the corner

to the table that the men had chosen as a resting spot and put the tray on the table.

I laid my hand on the blue eyed gentleman's cold hand. He looked up at me, with tears in his eyes, and said, "Thank you." I leaned over, began to pat his hand and said, "I did not do this for you, God is here working through me to give you hope." I cried as I walked away to join my husband and son.

When I sat down, my husband smiled at me and said, "That is why God gave you to me honey....to give me hope." We held hands for a moment and at that time we knew that only because of the Grace were we able to give. That day showed me the pure Light of God's sweet love.

On the last evening of class, with this story in hand, I turned in "my project". The teacher asked, "Can I share this?" She began to read aloud and that is when I knew that we, as human beings (part of God), share this need to heal. In my own way I had touched the people at McDonalds, my husband, son, instructor, and every one in the classroom on my last night as a college student. I graduated with one of the biggest lessons I would ever learn... be kind to ALL...after all...we are here to learn! Learn how to Love People and Use Things. NOT Love things and Use people.

You never know, you could be serving an angel.

Remembering a Christian family One year later.

Dear friends,

On August 5th 1997, tragedy struck the small town of McLennan, Alberta (pop. 1100). At 5:00 pm Cst. Shane Leiding, his wife Darla, their 1 year old daughter Kirsten and two other children with this family Jonah (7) and Joshua Hamelin (4) were killed instantly in a head on collision. A westbound light truck, for some unknown reason, swerved directly into the path of Shane's van. The driver of the truck [24 yr old Jennifer Hunchak] was seriously injured but the passenger, [22 yr old French medical student and intern, Helene Gardette] was killed.

Shane and Darla were a loving Christian couple. The day after the accident was to have been their daughter's 1st birthday. The other two children were the only children of Lee and Paulette Hamelin, who are also a fine Christian couple. All attended the small McLennan Evangelical Baptist church that we also attended when I was stationed in McLennan.

McLennan detachment is a small detachment of 6 members. I was the NCO i/c and I remember when Jack Turner learned I was going there, he wrote he would pray for another Christian officer to get transferred there so we would have Christian fellowship. I thought it was nice of Jack to pray for that, but I really did not think it would happen.

Well it was not too long thereafter that we were to receive a new recruit. I read his assessment from the training academy and noted that his evaluator remarked that he had "high morals". I knew this was good, but of course there are non-Christians who also hold to high standards.

When Shane arrived near the end of the week I had a small chit chat with him. I immediately liked him. He was a bit shy, yet obviously thrilled to finally be out in the field. That Sunday we missed church. Shane was there and learned that I was also a Christian. First thing Monday morning, there he was at the detachment with morning coffee. He was grinning from ear to ear as he told me he was a born again believer. He told me how he was well grounded in the Christian faith after being brought up in a Christian home and attending a Christian school.

We loved to talk about doing things important to serve our real boss, our Lord and Saviour.

The accident was devastating as we learned not only of their deaths but also of the death of our best friends and children. Our children also had to cope with the loss of their best friends. We are all better off for having briefly known Shane and Darla.

Members of the detachment recently remembered Shane by making a donation to the FCPO on the anniversary of the accident. This would please Shane very much. Hardly a day goes by that I do not think about them. It is reassuring to know they are in heaven. It always reminds me again that we must all do what is important while we are here on earth. We all must work hard for the Lord and encourage one another in faith.

WIVES, SUBMIT TO YOUR HUSBANDS - a defense to assault !

Incredible as it may sound I heard this on the radio recently in a story about a Guelph man who plead guilty last August to assaulting his wife. In his sentencing hearing he excused the assault by quoting Ephesians 5:22. That was it! He came home drunk and choked his wife in a fit of anger. She wasn't submitting. I thank God that the judge in the case did not accept the defense and jailed the man. In the judgement his honour quoted in return other scripture such as Eph. in 5:25 where it states "*Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, to make her holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word.*" And in Eph. 5:28-29 it states "*He who loves his wife loves himselfno one ever hated his own body, but he feeds and cares for it, just as Christ does the church.*"
