PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

These are exciting times in the outreach ministry of FCPO Canada. At our 2003 annual meeting held in Ottawa, Ontario in March, Supt H. E. (Hank) Harley (Ret.) of the Niagara Regional Police was unanimously appointed as FCPO Canada's First Executive Director. Hank's Law Enforcement Career as a committed Christian cop is best summed up in proverbs 22:29 "Do you see a man skilled in his work? He will serve before Kings; He will not serve before obscure men."

Hank and his wife Andrea have been faithful servants of FCPO Canada (serving in numerous roles) since our beginnings. The unity of our National Board, in confirming his appointment is an indicator of our high esteem for Hank.

Numerous inquiries and expressions of support have poured in for FCPO Canada recently from Windsor, Ontario, the Miramichi, Halifax, Newfoundland and Points West. What we have lacked is a timely follow-up to these contacts. Although our Executive Director doesn't officially com on-board until September 1, 2003, he has already assisted the Vice-President and myself in follow-ups.

N.B. Director Paul Doiron advises that our 2003 seminar on the Miramichi, a prelude to our 2004 conference has been supported by the Aboriginal community. Chief Roger Augustine is providing a meeting place for the 2003 seminar. Also, representatives of the Halifax Regional Police, Royal

Newfoundland Constabulary and Windsor City Police have joined or inquired about setting up chapters.

God will provide as the Holy Spirit leads. Proverbs offers us some timely advice in this period of transition. "Let your eyes look straight ahead, fix your gaze directly before you, make level paths for your feet and take only ways that are firm. Do not swerve to the right or the left."

In closing there is a passage of scripture found in the New Testament that speaks specifically to peacemakers. From James 3:13-18 inclusive.

"Who is wise and understanding among you? Let him show it by his good life, by deeds done in the humility that comes from wisdom.

But if you harbor bitter envy and selfish ambition in your hearts, Do not boast about it or deny the truth. Such wisdom does not come down from heaven but is earthly, unspiritual, of the devil, for where you have envy and selfish ambition.

There you will find disorder and every evil practice. But the wisdom that comes from heaven is first of all pure, then peace-loving, considerate,

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submissive, full of mercy and good fruit, impartial and sincere.

Peacemakers who sow in peace raise a harvest of righteousness."

Our Vice President, Cpl Andrew Cowan, RCMP and our new Executive Director, Supt. H.E. (Hank) Harley have an abundance of this heaven sent wisdom. Hopefully, by our 2004 conference in the Miramichi they will bring success to our vision, with increased responsibilities.

Tell others about Eph 4:32 and help free them to finally love the Lord and themselves.

Prayer Changes Things

My screen saver on my office computer is a constant reminder to people that walk in to see me of where my life is at just now: "Prayer changes things!" I had another screen saver there before but it never quite caught anyone's attention the way this one does. Besides which some things have happened in my life which have made it a real struggle for me to even want to change it. Some of those things happen to you recently?

Here we all are on automatic pilot in our lives. I 'd have to say that I have the best job in the whole country as co-ordinating chaplain for the Toronto Police Service. Some days you're up some days your down but it's like any job or calling. Then of course while you're sailing along, wham! My wife got sick and not just 'I've got a cold kind of sick' but so sick that she can't work anymore. Top it all off with a reduction in disposable income. Can't make the mortgage payments anymore. Applying for disability takes time and appeals. And then there was me, five months into disaster and I am sent to a specialist for a colonoscopy but the 'see you in two years' send off I got from the hospital turned into a 'see you in two days' from the doctor's office. You can guess what I was thinking.

It wasn't that I was not praying at the time I was. Some of my more conservative friends disputed whether I was praying hard enough. I was praying. I really was praying! At some moment in all of what transpired in my life it looked like my vertical communication pipeline to God had failed. I wondered, was I off my game? I mean I have been doing this all of my life, talking to God. I felt pretty confident that I could leave God in charge of my life for the times that I needed God to be in charge.

When had I started doing that? I mean when had I started this nonsense of praying to God, trusting God to take my life over and then taking back my prayer and doing it all myself. That revelation to me was a wake-up call. I had forgotten the fundamental rule in vertical communication to God. Sender error! I get these emails from people about the C-Nile virus that affects the sender of e-mail. Can't remember whom they sent what to. It's even worse than that. Sender error in prayer has to do with the corruption factor. I keep forgetting that my life is not perfect it has been corrupted by SIN. Now there is a word you don't hear every day! That corruption factor is responsible not only for sender error in prayer but a lack of faith. At the bottom of my communication problem with God was my own personal lack of faith in what God could do.

Can you imagine it! I have been riding with peace officers at times even in harms way protected only by a bullet-proof vest. I mean that was it! I had a 'brain cramp' (one of those disastrous thinking mistakes that can get you killed) or a faith cramp (a disastrous moment of lack of trust in

God that can get you killed) more likely. I had just been talking to myself the whole time and not really talking to God at all.

Here is my challenge to you who might also be doing what I was doing. The Lord says, "whatever you ask in my name will be given." Remember the target of your prayers, our heavenly Father but also remember that "if vou have the faith of a mustard seed you can move mountains." The looping prayers that I thought were vertical communication with God had me as the target and my faith had just been whittled down by life's events. I couldn't answer my prayers and my faith in myself was shot. I replaced those looping prayers with Father directed prayers inspired by the Spirit and in the name of Jesus but it has taken some real repentance on my part and I have seen now how prayer changes things. Prayer changes things only as long as the right Person is in charge of the sender and redeeming the communication.

It is true! Prayer changes things!

Integrity is from the Latin Integritas, meaning soundness, purity, and also from integer, whole, complete. It means steadfast adherence to a moral or ethical code, and also the condition of being sound and complete. When integrity is present, a person's thoughts, words and actions are all in alignment with each other. Integrity is essential if relationships are to be strong. Both in business and in personal life, integrity is one of the most highly valued character qualities. A word related to integrity is the word integration, which means, to make one. Its opposite is disintegration, which can be thought of as the state of dis integrity. In this state people go to pieces, relationships fall apart, trust is broken. Without integrity, life and relationships are fractured, unsound,

and incomplete. People hurt one another, whether they mean to or not. People deceive and are deceived. It's a devastating way to live.

We seek wholeness, completeness, soundness. And we don't like to be fooled or to misplace our trust. If we've been harmed by untrustworthy people, we all the more want relationships of integrity. Life is complicated enough without having to deal with people who are two-faced and duplicitous. When someone says they'll do something, we want them to simply do what they said they would do.
