Following Jesus More Clearly - Personal Hindrances

The Apostle Paul informed the Corinthian believers that if anyone was in Christ, then old things had passed away and all things had become new. Yet, I wonder some days just how much many of us feel brand new. In his letter to the Roman Church he describes the struggle that he was having at times and it is easy to tell just how this frustrated him.

What he was really describing was the conflict of the two natures. The first being the old nature, which if allowed, would pull back into his life all the religious and secular stuff that Christ had freed him from. The second being the new nature that had come alive in him at the time of his conversion, the one that wanted to be conformed to the image of Christ. Later in life Paul seems to have found the way to remain in this new nature and victoriously follow Jesus more clearly.

Read the following verse and identify those things that Paul by revelation had come to understand about his position in Christ:

..for in Him we live and move and exist (or have our being), even as some of your own poets have said, 'for we also are his children..(Acts 17:28)

I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me.' (Gal 2:20)

Two Nature Affecting Us

The old nature hangs around after conversion and continues to do its best to raise up and take over once again. The new nature within, now being developed, pushes back against the old nature and thus the conflict. The victory of the new over the old is totally dependant upon our choice of which we surrender to.

It is good therefore, for us to be able, as Paul was, to identify the characteristics of the two natures.

Read the following scriptures and identify those characteristics of each nature:

"Now the deeds of the flesh are evident, which are: immorality, impurity, sensuality, idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, outbursts of anger, disputes, dissensions, factions, envying, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these, of which I forewarn you, just as I have forewarned you, that those who practice (constantly do) such things will not inherit the kingdom of God. (Gal 5:19-21)

Therefore, consider the members of you earthly body as dead to immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed which amounts to idolatry. For it is because of these things that the wrath of God will come upon the sons of disobedience. (Col 3:5-6)

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law. Now those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desire. If we live by the Spirit, let us also walk by the Spirit. Let us not become boastful, challenging one another, envying one another. (Gal 5:22-26)

When we accept Christ as our Lord and Saviour the incorruptible seed (nature and attributes of Christ) come alive in us. As we grow in the faith and in our following Jesus, we should become more and more conformed to the image of Christ. As this occurs and we surrender more and more to the Holy Spirit operating in our lives, the character of God is formed within us and all of the character and attributes of our old self are pushed to the outside.

However, the enemy of our souls, whose nature the old attributes and character came from, hangs around us with his bag of ugly things looking for us to give him the change to once again plant one of those seeds of the old nature back into our lives.

In the Book of Hebrews we are warned not to allow a root of bitterness to grow up within us as it will in its time destroy us.

The same thing applies to the things of the old nature. If we allow them to be planted within us again they will take root with a vengeance and unless we recognize it and push them out again they too can grow up to destroy us.

Lets say that a fellow officer who you may not think is that great of a peace officer gets a promotion aver you. Well you think Lord if you had only checked with me first before you allowed that I could have told you a thing or two about that person.

So you fuss and stew and get jealous and envious about things and the next thing you know you are mad or depressed and hardly liking your job or anyone around you for that matter. It is a spiritual weed in your garden of peace, GET IT OUT OF THERE!

As I have studied the scriptures over many years now and sat under some awfully good teaching, I have come to recognize that there are seven things that are hindrances that can bump us off our journey with the Lord and reek havoc in our Christian lives.

The first hindrance is what I call "Look Good" Now there is nothing wrong with looking good in the way you do your job or the way you associate with others around you, except when you do it at the expense of others. By that I mean, you purposely choose to make others look bad so that you will look good.

The second is "Feel Good." When this enters your life it slowly brings about the attitude that only your feelings are important and as long as you feel good about it really doesn't matter how others feel.

The third is "Be Right." I tell you I have seen marriages destroyed and many an Church split all because some one had to be right.

Once while going to visit a couple as I went to knock on the door I could hear a very great commotion coming from inside the house. You could tell they weren't expecting me to have arrived quite so early. To make a long story short I learned that he just hated to see the bananas left out on the counter until the go "rotten" was how he was describing it. She on the other hand said she left them out there to "ripen" until she could use them to make banana bread. When I knocked on the screen

door, a great hush suddenly came over the situation and they both answered the door with perky little smiles on their faces. They did not ask how long I had been there and I didn't choose to tell them. We all had a great laugh about the situation and the fact that the argument really wasn't over the banana it was over whether it was ripe of rotten and one of them had to be right.

Watch for this in your life and the life of your work and marriage as this is one giant that can cause major problems in relationships.

The next is "Stay in Control." This one is very close to my heart because in all my years as a peace officer and paramedic, I entered many instances where I had to either be in control or take control. What I am saying here though is something very different.

Giving Christ control of your life means coming to recognize that it is in Him you live and move and have your being. You still have to do what you have to do as a peace officer when faced with your various responses, but you learn to do things in a way that the Holy Spirit is your guide in all things pertaining to life and godliness. I can't tell you the number of time in my career as a peace officer when the odds were not in my favor that the Holy Spirit gave me words that brought calm and peace to situations. I always liked words that brought calm and peace rather than having to fight my way in and out of events. Besides, I spent too much time getting that glossy shine on my boots and I hated to scuff them up unless I really had to.

The next hindrance I call "hidden agenda." When we approach life's circumstances and interact with others we always need to do so without hidden agendas. In simple words this means being up front and honest with one another. It doesn't take people around you very long to know whether you are a person of your word and a person of integrity. No one likes to be used by another person to fulfil that person's hidden agenda.

The sixth hindrance I call "personal advantage." Have you ever felt like you have been responsible to the success of an event only to have someone take the good work you have done and make it look as if they were responsible. Sure you have, and it is imperative that

you and I as Christian officers are never caught in this act of deceit when dealing with those around us.

Last but not least, the final hindrance is "remain undisturbed." As you function in your communities you will come across untold amounts of need. The story of the Good Samaritan in the Bible is the perfect example of this. Many passed by the injured man that day and remained undisturbed. The Good Samaritan however, did something about what he knew was an injustice. The very fact that you have accepted the calling to be a peace officer means that you are not happy with the injustice of he world around you.

Enforcing the law of the land is only one aspect of the profession you have chosen. A far more laudable aspect of you job is to recognize the suffering of those around you and do you part in meeting needs. What do I mean? Well it might be as simple as helping your elderly neighbour paint a fence, or becoming part of a Habitat for Humanity project to build a house for a less fortunate family. Let me tell you what will happen at a Habitat for Humanity build. You will often find that the very people you have to deal with during you shifts are those who assist with projects like these. It will give them an opportunity to see you in a different light and certainly give you the chance to see them from a different perspec-

Well I hope I have given you something to consider as you continue your own personal journey with the Lord and your journey as a Christian peace officer. I look forward to meeting you here in the coming issues as I continue to open more aspects of Knowing, Loving and Following Jesus.

The main speaker for the conference, Bob Vernon challenged the group and FCPO Canada to consider new ways to reach out and minister for Christ. Many great ideas were shared and many of them will be used to direct the actions and function of FCPO - Canada as we continue to move forward with this ministry.

Various persons in attendance shared experiences where the Lord had used them and the results of His answering prayers and meeting needs.

Executive Director Hank Harley was nominated to fill the role of keeping minutes in the absence of Merv Tippe.

Motion to accept the minutes of the Edmonton AGM - Ron Seney, 2nd Jesse Weeks. CARRIED

Treasurer Andrew Cowan was unable to be in attendance at this meeting. He advised President Marvin that the bank balance was a little over \$30,000.00 prior to the expenses for the AGM. This report was received by the Board. President Marvin advised that he had approached his home church in reference to making a regular donation to the FCPO and they have responded in the amount of \$100.00 per month. A letter of thanks will be forwarded to the

Board of the Huron Park Baptist Church in Woodstock, Ontario.

PeaceMaker

Merv Tippe asked that the need for memnbers of the Board, and persons from our membership in general to submit articles for the newsletter be raised. There are very few articles submitted to the Peacemaker from sources other than the Editor, the President and the Exec. Director. Merv has asked that although he could not be in attendance due to his health situation, that President Marvin implore the Directors from across the country to make regular submissions. Reports: -

Merv Tippe - Saskatchewan Report

Work continues with recruits of both police academies (RCMP Depot and the Saskatchewan Police College). Merv is in the final stages of clearance as a volunteer Chaplain with the RCMP at Depot Division which should continue to enhance our ability to have contact with recruits.

In the coming year Merv plans to approach the Saskatchewan Police College at the University of Regina to discuss the opportunities for Chaplaincy there. At present they do not have a designated chaplaincy presence.

Things have been very quiet as far as functions are concerned but as soon as the province of Saskatchewan decides to have Spring or Summer instead of Fall or Winter there will be an event planned.

Merv would recommend that the Board approach Gideons International and find out if they would be willing to have New Testaments printed with the FCPO logo on the outer cover similar to what they have done with the RCMP. If this costs us for the set up and such on the first printing it would be well worth our while. This would then replace the current Peace Officer's Bible presented to recruits on graduation.

Mery also felt that if FCPO wishes to hold an actual "Conference" every two or three years rather than an Annual General Meeting, we will need to discuss what we offer as session at present. This would mean finding Christian officers who would be able to present on subjects related directly to policing, but would also provide testimony of how the Lord has helped them use the skills in their career. An example would be to have a Christian officer speak on accident reconstruction or profiling or other topics related directly to the function of the job. This may bring more of the general membership to the conference as well as other officers. We of course would also offer topics directly related to spiritual growth. It just seems that if we are going to become a greater part of the lives of our general membership and other officers, we will need to re-think how we do business a bit.

The Atlantic Region held a regional breakfast in Halifax and our guest was a Supt. of the Halifax Regional Police, who is being recognized as the possible next Regional Chief.

Our Nova Scotia Rep., S/Cst. John Allen has circulated quality flyers to all RCMP Detachments, Municipal Police Forces, Halifax Regional Police, The Police Association of Nova Scotia (PANS), Municipal Association of Police Personnel and the Nova Scotia Government Employees Union. John Allen and I staffed a FCPO Booth at the annual conference of The Crime Prevention Society of Nova Scotia in Halifax. John has enrolled in Bible College and he has been appointed the Chair of the Evangelism and Outreach Committee of his Church. John Allen and I made a presentation to the RCMP Chaplains at their annual conference in Halifax. We presented a Bible to the C.O. of 'H' Division, A/Comm. Graham. We recruited some supporters for our help-line initiative.

Ron Seney met with the Deputy Director of the Atlantic Police Academy who was very receptive to the presenting of scriptures to the recruits. John Allen met with the rep of the Gideon Ministry who also supports the initiative. Copies of the Peacemaker and a professional poster about our helpline were circulated to our extensive mailing network.

S/Cst. Allen is Vice-President of his local of the Nova Scotia Government employees union which is opening doors. Ron Seney is a director of the Crime Prevention Society of Nova Scotia. helpline. Carolyn Blades-Seney (Ron's wife) assists with the FCPO. She is the co-coordinator of our Church prayer chain, so it is a good fit. There are many good examples of how the helpline has been a benefit to those who have called.

Financing for all of our initiatives at the chapter level, the Provincial level and the National help-line are donated by our chapter. Report concluded by Ron as he referenced 2 Timothy, Chpt 4. In verse 5 we are commanded to be sober in all things, do the work

of an evangelist and fulfill our ministry.


