

fast through the storms of life. It's called hope. In biblical terms, hope is closely allied with faith. The writer of Hebrews tells us that, faith is "the assurance of things hoped for" (Hebrews 11:1). Hope, therefore, is the object upon which we direct our focus and energies. To the Christian, hope is the knowledge that we are being changed for the better as we trust in God's promises (Romans 8:28). It is the conviction that no matter the circumstances, God's plans for our lives are "for good and not for disaster, to give you a future and a hope" (Jeremiah 29:11b NLT).





Are we following the call of God in our life and realizing the potential of the purpose for which we were created? Do you ever find yourself wondering this? Have you ever been driving down the road in the patrol car and wondered if what you are doing presently is what God really, really wanted you to be doing?

Well if you are like the rest of us that have been on this journey with the Lord through policing, I would be willing to say you have, because I can recall looking out the window of my patrol car and thinking the same thing. In Ester 4:14, Mordecai says; "And who knows whether you have not come to the kingdom for such a time as this?" While God's calling is somewhat unique for each person, there are special tasks to perform and special missions to fulfill and special people God calls to fulfill them.

Often we can become so wrapped up in the "job" we have to do from a human perspective, we can miss the "calling" we have to fulfull from a spiritual perspective. In other instances we are at times so inundated with just the everyday duties that need to be done we fail to see God's intent in our doing them. After 30+ year in emergency services and 40+ years of walking with the Lord I have learned that "God uses ordinary people and He calls them in the midst of ordinary circumstances to do extraordinary things.

As a follower of Christ and peace officers we are going to face an increasing number of decisions. Some of those decisions will be trivial, some will simply be a matter of preference, yet others will be moral and test our character. When this happens, our starting point, the foundation from which we begin will make all the difference in the world. Approaching these decisions without God leaves us to rely soley on ourselves and our limited ability to pull together the information required to weigh the options correctly and come up with the best decision for us and everyone else concerned.

For many, time will be their friend and they will be able to reason through these issues slowly, but for peace officer's we often do not have that luxury as hestitation could mean our life or the life of another. This then makes it very significant for us to know the heart of the One who sees the beginning from the end in all things.

If you were to ask any of us who have spent years in policing, the one thing I think we would tell young officers is to be a policeman or policewoman is a calling from God.

As people of faith we must say it is not my choice, but God's calling me to be a policeman or woman to serve society.

Being one who serves is the opposite of our natural inclination. Most of the time we are more interested in "serve us" than being of service. We often say we are looking for a place that meets our needs and blesses me, not I'm looking for a place to serve and be a

blessing to others, yet the sign of a mature follower of Jesus is they meet the needs of others.

God wants to use you to make a difference in His world. He wants to work through you to bring about a change in the way people see the police and the way police see people. That won't be easy and none of us would tell that it is, but all of us will tell that it is possible when you get the relationship with the One who has called you right.

YOU WILL RESPOND TO MANY CALLS IN YOUR LIFE AS A PEACE OFFICER, BUT NONE AS IMPORTANT AS THIS.



Slaying Your Goliath



The Philistine army had gathered for war against Israel, the two armies camped for battle on opposite sides of a steep valley. Forty long days they had been there and for forty long nights the Philistine giant, Goliath, measuring over nine feet tall came out mocking, chiding and challenging the army of Israel to fight. Saul, the King of Israel, and the whole army, dreaded these encounters, increasingly more and more agitated and terrified of Goliath.

Every single person who reads this article, at some point in life will face a "Goliath," or a situation in which it appears to be impossible to come out the other side victorious. In fact, it might look like your "Goliath" is going to take you "out" So, how do we deal with this Goliath? Well speaking only for myself, in my personal battles, I have always found it extremely important to properly identify the enemy.

You see, I think many times, because of the work we do and the environment we find ourselves in, we default to the temporal rather than the spritual. When this happens it is easy to misidentify the enemy as your boss, your husband or wife, or some other human opponent. The truth is that most of your battles as a Christian will be spiritual battles that show up through human infulence. I recall being hired by a rural police service to police a town of about a thousand people. The Chief of Police,

who arrived before me had received letters suggesting that if he didn't leave town his home would be bombed. The folks that ran the Bus Depot had a petition on the counter of their cafe for all to see, including us, supporting the removal of the local police service. One evening a bus arrived from points east with people on it from Manitoba and Ontario and you could hear her asking them to sign the petition and many did, even though they had, nor would they ever live in the community.

Now I could have viewed this as an attack of that couple, but remembering, "We do not wrestle against flesh and blood but against principalities and powers, against rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places," I committed it to prayer. Not long we received a call that a bus had arrived and the driver reported there was a fellow on the bus with a gun. To make a very long story short, we attended cleared the bus and quickly took the fellow into custody. That particular Goliath was slain that night and the petition was never again seen.

Back to our story; Jesse sends his youngest son, David, to the battle lines to bring back news of his brothers. That evening, David heard Goliath shouting his defiance and he recognized great fear stirred within the men of Israel. David responded with what I think is a classic and ever to be remembered statement; "Who is this uncircumcised Philistine that he should dare to defy the armies of the living God?"

Something stirred in the basement of David's soul (which by the way I believe was the Holy Spirit) and his words shattered the situation. I was stirred that way more than once as I responded to calls where I found myself to be the lone officer on duty and people would try and threaten or intimidate. I would pray Lord give me the words that will shatter this resistance. I am able to testify that is exactly what happened and my hat stayed on my head and my boots retained their shine. There were of course occasions it did take more than words to diffuse and take the cuprits into custody and I was up for that also.

Back to the story. So David approached Goliath, and in true form the giant cursed at him, hurling threats, actually laughing at David. David's response was; "You come against me with sword and spear and javelin, but I come against you in the name of the Lord Almighty, the God of the armies of Israel, whom you have defied ... today I will give the carcasses of the Philistine army to the birds of the air ... and the whole world will know that there is a God in Israel ... for the battle is the Lord's and He will give you into our hands."

Why this young man, why would the Lord

choose him for this time? First, David was very set in the fact that the Lord was on his side despite the circumstances. Second, he was confident the Lord would see him through and out the other side. Third, he was comfortable in his relationship with God, never doubting the Lord had his best interests at heart. Finally, he knew the Lord was faithful and that when he had done all he could to stand, God would step in and do a miracle if that was needed.

So the question for each of us is this: Could we be a David for the Lord? The four factors that helped David defeat his Goliath will do the same for us, but first we have to get there. Check out Proverbs 3: 5-6 and let it be your starting point.




