Being guided to where the best parking lot would be, and immediately connecting with a taxi driver was perfect timing not only to get to where we wanted to go but to meet Willie our taxi driver. As we entered the van Willie greeted us and the Lord led us to share a kind word about the Lord.

As we spoke about God's blessings and our FCPO outreach to Peace Officers - I heard Willie state "God is Speaking to me today" several times. I also noticed that Willie had a green pocket size New Testament that was on the dash of his vehicle.

Silver or Gold we did not have nor did our giving make this person rich. Generosity isn't about money, it's about an attitude of the heart. Generosity is fueled by compassion and money.

University of Cincinnati police officer Ray Tensing is currently facing a murder charge following the <u>July 19 shooting</u> <u>of Samuel DuBose</u>. Once a charge is laid it is usually the practice of all officials to refrain from commenting on the case. I was shocked to hear the prosecutor state the officer "purposely killed him" calling the officer's actions "asinine" and "senseless," and stating the officer "should never have been a police officer," as well as calling the stop "a chicken crap" traffic stop. I've never heard such comment before a trial – it is wrong!

First, let me comment on the traffic stop. If the law requires a front license plate, then the police are there to ensure the law is respected. Often a "routine" stop turns out to be something much more interesting! Next, although one can form an opinion by reviewing video, if you're a prosecutor, keep that opinion to yourself until the appropriate time. Finally, on the issue of whether or not officer Tensing ought to have ever been a police officer, I don't know, and I suspect the prosecutor does not know either. Whether this officer is guilty or not should be determined fairly and objectively in a court of law.

What I do know is we need to pray for officer Tensing and his family and loved ones as well as those of Mr. DuBose. I suspect officer Tensing never got up that morning intent on killing someone. This is a tragedy for him, his loved ones and the department. Likewise, I'm sure Mr. DuBose never anticipated dying on that day – a tragedy for his loved ones as well. We need to pray for justice, and to pray for all our comrades that they will be safe and discerning at all times. I would hate for officers to second guess their training and use of force continuum for fear of an outlandish public rebuke. For those who are believers, know that God is with you and trust he will give you wisdom and strength in the time of need. As I said in <u>Syracuse:</u> "The Lord is good, a strong hold in the day of trouble; and he knoweth them that trust in him" (Nahum 1:7).
