

Conference 2016

A 2016 Conference Highlight

Well the dust has settled from the 2016 National Conference in Moncton but the memories of that conference are still very much alive and fresh. For me, there were many highlights. From the intense and inspiring story of our special speaker, Ali Perez whom I had the opportunity to hear 3 times over the conference about God's amazing power to cover "Your Six" to the messages from our other speakers, to a wonderful church parade to conclude the conference. I could go on. There is one story however I do want to share with those who were not able to attend as I do believe it is intended to encourage those who may be discouraged or may be facing challenges in their work as peace officers.

On the Saturday before the conference, our home was included in a community yard sale. One of our neighbours, whom we have known ever since we moved to the community in 2006 dropped by and shared something with me that was disturbing to her. We chatted about this and then my attention went to her son Ryan, whom I knew was at one time a number of years ago a member of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, injured in a work related motor vehicle accident that left him impaired and disabled.

I asked Carol (his mother) if she thought Ryan might want to participate in our church parade on Sunday, June 5th. Carol responded that she thought he might want to do so but would discuss it with him. Shortly after that conversation, I received confirmation from Ryan himself that he would be very happy to participate. So then my mind started racing (as it usually does) and I thought: "What if Ryan in his wheelchair could lead the parade carrying the Canadian flag?" I had a conversation with Staff Sgt. Major Gilles Cote who is the protocol officer for the RCMP in J Division and he stated: "I will go a step further, I will have both outgoing "J" Division Commanding Officer Assistant Commissioner Roger Brown and incoming Assistant Commissioner Larry Tremblay escort Ryan behind the Codiac Pipes & Drums Band." Well now - what a blessing for everyone, especially for Ryan. When I broke the news to Ryan and his family, they were ecstatic! And so he did. Besides this, I asked Ryan if he would share his story to conference participants during the conference and once again - so he did.

That was our very first session on Friday morning to start the conference and everyone was deeply moved by his story as he, with help from him mother and a PowerPoint presentation, painted a picture of him growing up, his training at Depot in Regina, the accident, the rehabilitation and life in general for Ryan.

Since then, I have had one more opportunity to hear Ryan share his story at his old home church in Rexton, N.B. Ryan wore his Fellowship of Christian Peace Officer golf shirt and so did I as Bonnie and I were there to support him and promote the ministry of the Fellowship of Christian Peace Officers.

I do believe that God will use Ryan and his story to touch the lives of many peace officers - across Canada! Once you hear his story, you will walk away knowing that there is a God and that he does care and gives each one of us a purpose. It is not necessary that you determine what your calling is, although you will be tempted to do so. It will emerge naturally. When it does, as in Ryan's case, it may not at all look like what you thought it was going to be.

I leave you with this verse to encourage you my brothers and sisters in your faith: "But I have raised you up for this very purpose, that I might show you my power and that my name might be proclaimed in all the earth" (Exodus 9:16). I hope you are encouraged by Ryan's story.

My Story

My name is Ryan Daigle. I grew up in Rexton, N.B. I have one younger brother, Randy and my parents are Val and Carol. Growing up, I wanted to become a police officer. My brother, Randy and I and my neighbour friend, Rheal, used to play cops and robbers a lot. Needless to say, I had to be the cop and Randy and Rheal - the robbers. I grew up in a Christian home and went to church from the age of 5. When I was 10 years old, I accepted Jesus as my Lord and Saviour and was baptized. I finished high school in 2000 and then went on to Mt. Allison University in Sackville, N.B. to start my commerce degree. I had applied to join the RCMP when I was of legal age to do so and was just waiting for my call. That call came in 2003 when I was in the 3rd year of my degree at Mt. Allison.

I began training in August of 2003 and finished in December, 2003. I was posted to Prince George, B.C. I worked all of 2004 and loved my

job. I couldn't believe that they paid me for doing this. It was all I expected and more. I joined a church in Prince George and though I missed my family, I made many good friends and my colleagues were great.

Then on January 15, 2005, I was dispatched to a domestic dispute on the outskirts of Prince George. The roads were very bad and I hit a patch of black ice and I struck a utility pole. I was taken unresponsive to Prince George Regional Hospital, then on to Vancouver General. I was there for a total of 21 days and then transferred back to Moncton. I was still in a coma and my parents had been told that since my brain swelling had gone down and I was not awake, there was a very good chance I would never wake up and I would remain in a vegetative state. **BUT PRAISE BE TO MY GOD**, I did wake up slowly in April of 2005, after 3 full months in a coma. My parents, church family and friends had been praying for me and my family was by my side the whole time. Once I woke up, I started therapy in Moncton and then was transferred to Stan Cassidy Rehabilitation Center in Fredericton, N.B.

Since the accident the Lord has been very close to me and has given me this courage and drive to not give up and I know God has left me here with work He has for me to do. I believe he has supplied the love and support I need here from family, friends and support workers. I have never been bitter about the accident and I don't question God as to why. Of course, I would not have this to happen to me or anyone, but I feel God is using me in a way to give encouragement to others and to promote His kingdom.

While I was recovering over the years, it was very hard to go to church to worship in my condition, so I would listen each Sunday to one of my mentors - Charles Stanley with In Touch Ministries. I was always encouraged and strengthened through Dr. Stanley's teachings.

Romans 8:38-39 says: "For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Not even sever brain injury, in my case, can separate me from His love.
