As always we would love to hear from you, and would welcome your thoughts and articles for this publication. Your story can touch a fellow officer and encourage them. Send your story to: tous.com



Are We Taking Inventory?

Today I am writing on self-reflection of where we are going in life. Let us examine our priorities and what we value in life and never forget the ultimate priority of our existence on this earth is to serve our Lord and Savior in the best capacity that we can. How do we serve our Lord one asks? By reading the revealed word of God in the scriptures it will guide you as to what needs to change in your life in order to truly serve Him. The question we must ask ourselves as we take inventory of our lives is: are we willing to obey

There are numerous definitions of what a soul is, but the most common biblical translation is the spiritual and immortal part of a person. To God, the soul defines who we are as individuals. "Gain the whole world, and lose his own soul" describes the sacrifice of spiritual well-being in favor of worldly goods and pleasures. A basic paraphrase is: What good does it do someone to gain the whole world and forget about God in the process? Our Lord is calling us to take inventory and realize that there is much more to life - "For we brought nothing into this world and obviously we cannot take anything out of the world." 1Timothy 6:7. "But those who crave to be rich fall into temptation and a snare and into many foolish - useless, godless, and hurtful desires that plunge men into ruin and destruction and miserable Pershing." 1Timothy 6:9.

Remember our God is prepared to bless us and has blessed us already with many good talents and material things. He wants us to recognize Him as the author of all good things that are bestowed upon us - but most important, He wants us to ask ourselves - how are we using our talents and blessings? A jail is the last place where this 56 year old Christian could have ever imagined himself working and yet I have now just completed my 12th year of employment. The past 5 years have been among the most rewarding.

As a Correctional Officer it is my responsibility to maintain order within the living units of which I have been assigned. These units are home to an assortment of maximum security inmates who are awaiting trial. Each work placement is based on seniority having the duration of 1year. In my case I have maintained the same assignment for the past 5 years which has allowed me sufficient time to develop a rapport with both my colleagues and with the inmates.

As a Christian I am an ambassador for Christ. For this reason I am always cognisant of my behaviour. It has been a practice of mine since conversion to constantly look for new opportunities to share my testimony with others. This practice has opened many doors for me "to preach the gospel and bring glad tidings of good things" (Romans 10:15) to this captive audience of both inmates and officers.

My jail nicknames are the "Rev", "Pastor "or even "Gospel God". Each is a title that I regard to be a compliment.

WHEN YOUR EGO GETS TOO BIG!

Have you ever heard the proverb "Pride goes before destruction, a haughty spirit before a fall"? This biblical proverb (Proverbs 16:18) is lived out every day in many organisations. Ego can be an ally but "unchecked" ego will become one of

your worst enemies.

The effects of ego in the life of leaders can sometimes be seen in the military and para-military organizations like the police.

A leader driven by ego will have a "closed mind" and becomes blindly obsessed by an overinflated sense of their importance and sees the world revolving on the axis of "self". This often results in self-promotion and "exploiting", taking advantage of others in order to fulfill their own desires or self-aggrandizement. Take for example Alexander the Great. He was educated by Aristotle, regent of Macedonia at eighteen, king at twenty and dead at thirty-three. This undefeated warrior, searching for more worlds to conquer died from an alcoholic liver disease, fever, and strychnine poisoning. His unchecked ego and power left a 32,000 kilometer trail of slaughter and rampage. His wife Roxana and son were murdered and Alexander's line became extinct. All his efforts amounted to nothing and the proverb "Pride goes before destruction, a haughty spirit before a fall" was certainly true in his case.

A good level of self-esteem will drive leaders to intentional and significant accomplishments. But when a leader's ego goes unchecked, it becomes pride and he / she is blinded to reality. They don't take advice nor listen to reason because they believe that "their way" is the only way. So rather than assume responsibility for their poor leadership, they point fingers and blame others. Bashar al-Assad is a great example of a leader who created chaos in his country, Syria, and rather than assume responsibility for the care and safety of his people, he is obstinately continuing in the same destructive patterns. The consequence is that the UN and democratic countries of the world are having to take responsibility for millions of migrants who would have preferred to raise their families in their own country. How many organisations have been hurt or destroyed by leaders who led them into grandiose projects simply because their leader needed a platform to "prove" how influential and worthy they were.

I was taught in the military that as a leader, every problem in my organisation is my problem. So good leaders stay up at night to find solutions and better ways of doing things. Great leaders with a healthy level of selfesteem and humility look for like-minded people who will partner with them to make a difference rather than perpetuate confusion and chaos. It was these characteristics in Jesus Christ that made him such a powerful leader, not his ego.

This truth is applicable in the day-to-day leadership of Christian peace officers. Here is a great video worth listening to where Navy SEALS explain how your ego can destroy.
